

By suburb, the highest concentrations of people aged 5 to 19 years were:

- Macquarie Links 38.2%
- Long Point 32.6%
- Raby 31.4%
- Bow Bowing 29.2%
- Minto Heights 28.5%

Whilst the lowest concentrations of people aged 5 to 19 years were in:

- Liverpool 19.0%
- Edmondson Park 19.1%
- Ingleburn 21.6%

The suburbs with the greatest share of people aged over 55 years were:

- Leppington 28.7%
- Austral 26.0%
- Greendale 22.7%
- Lurnea 20.6%
- Glenfield 20.1%

The suburbs with the lowest proportion of people aged 55 years and over were:

- Hoxton Park 7.2%
- Hoxton West 7.6%
- Raby 8.4%

Languages other than English (LOTE)

There is a similar proportion of people living in Contract Region 2 with little or no English language skills compared to the Regions overall. At the time of the 2001 Census, only 4% of the population in Region 2 either did not speak English well or not at all, compared to 5% for the Contract Regions as a whole.

The proportion of people with little or no English speaking skills living in Contract Region 2 by LGA are presented in the following table.

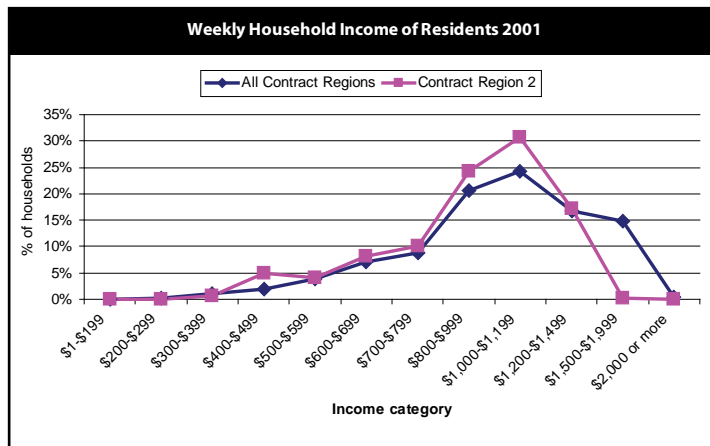
Average Household Size

In 2001 the average household size in Contract Region 2 was 3.2, compared with 2.9 for all Regions. Within Region 2, the average household size in the Camden and Liverpool LGAs was 3.3, whilst it was 3.1 for Campbelltown LGA.

Household Incomes

The average weekly household income (including multi-employee households) for Region 2 in 2001 was \$800-\$899, compared with \$1,000-\$1,199 for all Regions.

The average weekly income for the area of Campbelltown LGA in Contract Region 2 was \$800-\$899, whilst for the areas of Camden and Liverpool LGAs it was \$1,000-\$1,199.



Socio-Economic Disadvantage

The Australian Bureau of Statistics produces the “SEIFA” index (Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas 2001) of relative advantage and disadvantage. The index covers all areas in Australia and has been designed to have an average of 1,000. Low values indicate areas of disadvantage, and high values indicate areas of advantage. It takes into account variables such as the proportion of families with high incomes, people with a tertiary education, and employees in skilled occupations.

The index shows that Camden is the most advantaged LGA in Region 2, however 96% of Region 2’s population live in either the Campbelltown or Liverpool LGAs.

Disability

Information on the proportion of the population in Contract Region 2 with a disability was sourced from the Australian Bureau of Statistics’ National Regional Profile for 2003. According to this data, an average of 8% of the residents of Camden, Campbelltown and Liverpool LGAs received either an Aged Pension or a Disability Support Pension. This could mean that across Region 2 there are around 11,000 people with some form of disability.

Education

At the time of the 2001 Census, 27% of residents in Contract Region 2 were attending educational institutions, compared to 25% of the residents of the Regions as a whole.

Just over 19% of the population in Region 2 are school students, compared to 15% across all Regions. This reflects the slightly higher than average population aged 5 to 19 years in Region 2.
