Vehicle Maintenance Plans Clause 16 of the *Regulation*

Introduction

Clause 16 of the Transport Regulation 2007 states that “the operator of a relevant service must have, and adhere to, a public passenger vehicle maintenance plan that is consistent with the maintenance standards of the manufacturer used to provide the service.”

Guideline

Generic type vehicle maintenance plans (such as A, B, C and D’s) are not accepted by the Ministry. Vehicle maintenance plans can be located by contacting bus manufacturer’s, enthusiasts, bus museums, other bus operators or by using the internet.

Maintenance schedules which exceed the manufacturer’s maintenance standards are acceptable.
