CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON CAMPBELLTOWN'S NEW COMMUTER CAR PARK

The NSW Government is delivering 7,000 new commuter car parking spaces over the next two years.

Minister for Transport David Campbell today joined Campbelltown MP Graham West to turn the first sod of a new commuter car park for the region.

Mr Campbell said the NSW Government had allocated \$170.6 million in this year's State Budget to deliver additional commuter car parks across Sydney, the Blue Mountains, the Illawarra and the Central Coast.

"The NSW Government is building 7,000 new commuter car parking spaces and today is a milestone for the extra 350 spaces that have been allocated for Campbelltown," Mr Campbell said.

"The Government is encouraging more people out of their cars and on to our public transport network and delivering commuter car parks will go a long way towards achieving this.

"Today's sod turning represents the start of construction here at Campbelltown, with work to be funded by the NSW Government and carried out by Campbelltown City Council."

Mr West said the Government's investment in Campbelltown was a boon for the region.

"This investment will result in a great facility for local residents and up to 30 locals will work on its construction," Mr West said.

"The additional spaces will be added to the Farrow Road car park near the station and will take the total car park to around 750 spaces.

"The new facility will also increase accessible parking spaces for people with mobility needs, improve safety and security through improved lighting, fencing and CCTV and security cameras and also improve landscaping.

"This car park will make a real difference to the commute for many local residents.

"I also welcome the partnership the Government has formed with Campbelltown City Council to deliver the new car park by the end of the year."
