COUNTRYLINK PASSENGERS URGED TO CHECK NEW TIMETABLE

The NSW Government is investing \$3.6 billion in 626 new carriages for commuters.

Wednesday 30 September 2009

Minister for Transport David Campbell today reminded passengers who use CountryLink train and bus services that timetables would change on Sunday 11 October, to coincide with a new timetable for the CityRail network.

Mr Campbell said while the majority of the changes were minor, people should plan ahead and find out how the changes might affect their journey.

“Some trains, such as the Brisbane to Sydney XPT, will be leaving earlier so I’m encouraging people to have a look at the new timetable and make sure they’re across the changes,” Mr Campbell said.

“It’s important for customers to be aware of the new timetable and its start date, and where they can access detailed information about the new timetable.

“We also urge customers who have purchased tickets before 29 July this year for travel on, or after 11 October, to check the new timetable and revise the time printed on their tickets.”

Mr Campbell said CountryLink staff would also contact those customers.

“Anyone wishing to confirm their travel details should contact the CountryLink Reservations and Timetable infoline on 132 232,” Mr Campbell said.

Posters and flyers detailing the new timetables have been distributed throughout the CountryLink network.
