BETTER ACCESS ARRIVES AT OATLEY STATION

Minister for Transport and Infrastructure Andrew Constance today joined Member for Oatley Mark Coure to mark the completion of the first stage of works to improve access at Oatley Station.

The new overhead footbridge, stairs, and lifts providing access to platforms 1 and 2 are now open to customers as part of the overall station upgrade.

“This is great news for Oatley Station customers with the two new lifts making it easier for people with a disability, the elderly, parents with prams and travellers with luggage to access public transport,” Mr Constance said.

“The improvements were made possible through our Transport Access Program, which is delivering modern, safe and accessible transport infrastructure right across the state.”

Mr Coure said focus is now on completing the western forecourt at Mulga Road, where a new set of stairs and a lift will be installed.

“The access improvements we’ve delivered today are just a sign of things to come as we ramp up activity to deliver the full upgrade of Oatley Station,” Mr Coure said.

“To enable the further works to be completed safely, the stairs from the River Road underpass will be temporarily closed with all customer access to be from the Oatley Parade side of the station.

“I’d like to thank local residents and Oatley Station customers for their patience as we get on with the job of delivering the rest of this fantastic upgrade as quickly as possible.”

At other locations in Sydney’s south, customers are benefiting from the major upgrades recently completed at Waterfall Station, while Sutherland Station has received a new multi-storey car park and lift access to Platform 1.

Narwee and Jannali Stations are next in line for an accessibility upgrade with construction planned to commence at these stations later this year.
