About the Barangaroo Wharf

The new Barangaroo ferry wharves will serve Sydney's newest harbourside residential and commercial district with increased capacity for ferry services to meet future demand.

The wharves will provide berthing space for additional ferry services from the Parramatta River and the lower North Shore, integrating with the recently opened Wynyard Walk pedestrian tunnel to provide a seamless connection between rail, bus and ferry, similar to Circular Quay.



Operating hours

- 5am to midnight Monday to Friday
- 7am to midnight Saturday and Sunday

Special events such as New Year's Eve may require extended operating hours.

The wharf will be used to dock ferries overnight Services will operate according to the latest timetable.

Features

The Wharf will have facilities for customer safety and comfort including seating, lighting, passenger information display screens, weather protection and ticketing pods.

-) 20 CCTV cameras on each wharf
- It is fully accessible for prams and wheelchairs
- 20 bicycle parks are located at the base of 400 Barangaroo Avenue, approximately 50 metres south of the wharf.

Opal cards

There will be six top up and ticket machines.

To get an Opal card to keep, reload and reuse, you will need to visit an Opal retailer.

There are currently two Opal retailers within a 300 metre walk of Barangaroo Wharf.
