


Transport Access Program

Warrawee Station Upgrade

Project update

November 2019



The NSW Government is improving accessibility at Warrawee Station. This upgrade will be delivered as part of the Transport Access Program, an initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering modern, safe and accessible infrastructure.

Planning approval for the Warrawee Station Upgrade has been granted. Early work is due to start in November 2019 and construction is expected to be completed by the end of 2020.

Transport for NSW has engaged Haslin Constructions to deliver this work on its behalf.

Project overview

The Warrawee Station Upgrade aims to provide a station precinct that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents with prams and customers with luggage.

Key features of the upgrade include:

- a new lift between the platform and existing footbridge
- a canopy from the new lift to the station building on the platform

- new accessible parking spaces and a kiss and ride space on Heydon Avenue
- new kiss and ride spaces on Warrawee Avenue
- new accessible pathways through the station precinct
- a new family accessible toilet and unisex ambulant toilet
- a new bike shelter
- improvements to CCTV and lighting to increase safety and security.

Start of early work

Site surveys have commenced, and other early work is scheduled to begin in **November 2019**. This work includes:

- · geotechnical investigations
- locating underground services
- surveying the existing platform, station buildings, and surrounding footpaths and properties
- establishing a site compound within the rail corridor.

Equipment which will be used during this work includes a small drilling rig, excavators, survey equipment, trucks, light vehicles, power tools, and hand tools.

Work will take place during standard construction hours from 7am to 6pm Mondays to Fridays and Saturdays 8am to 1pm.

Due to delivery of machinery and equipment, there may be some temporary changes to parking and access at the station. Construction crew will be available on site to assist pedestrians with any changes.

Weekend work - Saturday 16 November to Sunday 17 November

To ensure the safety of our customers and staff, work to relocate services and perform geotechnical investigations at the station will be completed during a scheduled Sydney Trains track work weekend, when no train services will be operating.

This work will take place between **6am and 6pm on Saturday 16 November and Sunday 17 November 2019**. Measures will be implemented wherever possible to reduce noise associated with this work, including turning off vehicles when not in use, using non-tonal reversing beepers and stopping work for respite periods. We will monitor work activities to make sure noise levels are being managed effectively.

Public display - What we heard

The Review of Environmental Factors (REF) was on public display from Tuesday 30 April until Tuesday 14 May 2019. Stakeholders and the community were invited to submit feedback on the proposed designs during the public display period. Key themes that emerged were:

- general support for the station becoming accessible
- requests for more commuter parking
- suggestions to improve the road configuration and lighting on Hastings Road and Warrawee Avenue to improve traffic flow and safety
- · suggestions to improve disability parking
- requests for additional bicycle parking to be made available at the station.

Thank you to those who provided valuable feedback during this time. All feedback submitted during the public display period was considered by the project team during the determination of this project.
