

Transport Access Program Kingswood Station Upgrade



Kingswood Station Upgrade is now complete and the community is able to use the station's new and improved accessibility features.

Customers can use two new lifts to access both platforms and station amenities, including a new family accessible toilet and an ambulant toilet. CCTV and lighting have been improved to increase safety and security around the station precinct.

The project was completed as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure.
