Warrabee Station Upgrade

Project update

August 2020

The NSW Government is improving accessibility at Warrabee Station. The upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, an initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering modern, safe, and accessible infrastructure.

The upgrade will provide a station that is accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, carers/parents with prams and customers with luggage.

Upcoming work

The Warrabee Station Upgrade is nearing completion. Final work to be undertaken in August includes:

- installing street furniture and a bike shelter
- installing tactile indicators
- installing new anti-slip stair nosings
- installing platform signage
- testing and commissioning the new lift
- testing and commissioning the new station systems including communications, CCTV and Opal card readers
- installing handrails to the footbridge and stairs
- site clean-up.

Equipment

Equipment to be used may include hand tools, generators, light and medium size vehicles for deliveries. Specialist equipment will also be used to install the tactile ground surface indicators, including a drilling rig.

Platform changes from Monday 27 July

As part of platform resurfacing work, new permanent tactile ground surface indicators will be installed along the edge of the platform.

Tactile indicators are raised markings placed parallel to the platform edge to warn pedestrians with vision impairment.

This work will be done in stages between **9am and 3pm, Monday to Friday**. Work areas will be delineated using bollards and tape and supervised at all times. Work will also pause while customers board or alight the trains.

During this installation period, temporary non-slip yellow tape will be used to mark the edge of the platform.

Additional measures including additional station staff, frequent announcements, and directional signage will also be used to ensure pedestrian and customer safety.

Lift testing

Lift testing will be done August. We thank you for your patience while this testing is completed.
