

Project update March 2021

The Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link is a pedestrian and bicycle path between Sutherland and Cronulla, making walking and bike riding a more convenient, safe and enjoyable transport option.

The first stage between Sutherland and Kirrawee connects key destinations such as transport interchanges, schools, residential areas and business precincts.

#### **Lighting upgrades at Sutherland**

Stage One of the Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link was completed in April 2020.

Lighting upgrades will be completed in Sutherland during March 2021. The work will involve installing new street lighting at McCubbens Lane, Merton Street and Auburn Street.

The work will involve a local power interruption on the following dates. Affected properties will be notified by Ausgrid directly.

- McCubbens Lane Monday 15 March and Monday 29 March
- Auburn Street Thursday 25 March
- Merton Street Monday 29 March

#### Night work – 8 to 30 March 2021

For the safety of our workers and the community, some work will be carried out at night from **6pm to 7am** on up to 14 nights between **Monday 8 March and Tuesday 30 March 2021.** 

The work will involve installing new lights along sections of the new shared path.

Equipment to be used includes elevated work platforms, vacuum excavation trucks and cranes.

The work may be noisy at times. We will implement measures to minimise noise including completing noisy work as early as possible, switching equipment off when not in use, placing equipment as far away from residential properties as possible, and monitoring our work to ensure noise levels are being managed effectively.

# Temporary traffic and parking changes

Temporary lane closures and traffic detours may be in place at McCubbens Lane, Merton Street and Auburn Street during the work. Pedestrian and resident access will be maintained at all times.

Up to six car spaces will be temporarily unavailable on Eton Street, near the corner of McCubbens Lane between **6pm and 7am** from **Monday 8 March to Tuesday 30 March 2021.** 

Please follow the directions of traffic controllers and signs, and allow extra travel time.
