Wahroonga Station Upgrade

Transport for NSW | Project Update – April 2022

Transport for NSW is upgrading Wahroonga Station to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

After 17 months of major construction, the Wahroonga Station Upgrade is almost complete. Final work is underway at the station.

Upcoming work

Work will continue in April 2022, it includes:

- installing new fencing and completing brickwork on new road barriers along Redleaf Avenue bridge walkway
- line marking on the Redleaf Avenue bridge
- finishing work to new pedestrian ramp
- landscaping work and general cleaning.

Temporary full bridge closure

We previously notified you of our night work for March, that was postponed due to bad weather. We will now complete this work in April.

The Redleaf Avenue bridge will be temporarily closed to traffic for:

- **one night** on either **Wednesday 13 April** or **Thursday 14 April**
- **one night** between **Tuesday 19 April** and **Friday 22 April**, weather permitting.

Night work will be carried out on the bridge, including:

- installation of waterproofing membrane along new concrete bridge deck
- installation of new asphalt wearing course along Redleaf avenue & Railway Avenue.

Detours will be in place for southbound motorists via Ingram Road or Rohini Street and for northbound motorists via Rohini Street. Please follow the direction of traffic control and speed limited.

Station night work

We will be working on communication and electrical testing on the station platform for **one night** between **Wednesday 20 April to Friday 22 April from 12am to 4am**. We will notify the community in advance once the date has been confirmed.

Construction hours

Our standard construction hours are from 7am to 6pm every day, including Sundays and public holidays. We will update the community if any work is required outside these hours.

This work is in line with the current Public NSW Health Orders and a COVID-19 Safe plan is in place.

How will this work impact you

The work may be noisy at times however we will stop noisier activities such as using concrete saw or chainsaw, prior to **midnight**.

The equipment used for our work may include, line marking trucks, road mills, road saws, lighting towers, excavators, pozi tracks, tipper trucks and various hand tools.
