Wolli Creek Power Supply Upgrade Project



What are we doing in Wolli Creek?

Transport for NSW is building a new substation within the rail corridor to create the necessary power supply to support the increase in the number of trains travelling along the T8 Airport line in the future.

We are also extending the platform canopy at Wolli Creek Station to increase weather protection and encourage customers to use the full length of the platform, reducing crowding at busy times.

What happened last month?

During May, we carried out the installation of service utilities, piling work for the new substation structure, introduced permanent downpipes and bird proofing elements on the platform.

What's planned next?

During June, the following work will be carried out:

- concrete pour for the substation structure
- cable route construction
- installation of sign posts
- installation of service utilities
- canopy roofing and downpipe installation
- asphaltting work to platform 3 and 4.

Are there activities planned outside standard construction hours?

Some construction work will be completed outside of standard construction hours to enable the construction team to safely carry out our essential activities inside the rail corridor.

To facilitate this, work will take place during scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running.

Work has been scheduled to occur from:

- **6am, Saturday 19 June to 8pm, Sunday 20 June**
- **6am, Saturday 26 June to 10pm, Sunday 27 June.**

When carrying out the concrete pour for the base of the substation, some deliveries may need to arrive outside standard construction hours. If this occurs after 6pm, we do not expect this work to be noisy.

Where will work take place?

The above map shows the location of work inside the rail corridor with site access via Henderson and Lusty Streets.

This work is dependent on weather and site conditions and is subject to change.

There are also a number of other Transport for NSW and Sydney Trains projects working near our project during these scheduled trackwork weekends. We will be coordinating with these projects to manage the cumulative impact of this work on local residents. It is expected this work will generate noticeable noise for some residents. We will contact residents directly impacted by these construction activities.

How do we consider the community?

The project team understands construction activities may cause some disruption for the community and we will seek to minimise impacts as much as possible.

When carrying out our work, the project team utilises a noise assessment of the programmed activities to determine the noise to be generated and the appropriate mitigation measures to be put in place. We will also continue to ensure we adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to vibration and dust management.

Thank you for your understanding and patience while we complete this important work.

Changes to construction hours

To support the construction industry through Coronavirus, the NSW Government have extended an amendment to the legislation regarding standard construction hours. This amendment enables activities across all our sites to be carried out between **7am and 6pm on weekdays, weekends and public holidays**.
