A look at the line



The NSW Government will implement a new timetable on 20 October 2013. It's a major rewrite of the timetable and has been designed to improve the customer experience.

The new timetable will deliver more services, improve connections between different modes of public transport and reduce many journey times.

The timetable will also be easier for customers to use, with fewer stopping patterns and more consistent service times, particularly in peak periods.

Customers who travel longer distances from outer suburban areas will notice fewer stops and reduced journey times in many instances.

Customers closer to the CBD will receive frequent, more evenly spaced services, with many stations receiving 'turn up and go' services

The train timetable will provide customers using the Eastern Suburbs Line with:

- Frequent services all day, every day from all stations. Extra trains on the Eastern Suburbs Line will provide a minimum six services in each direction between 5am and midnight. This means catching a train to and from the city from the busy and popular Eastern Suburbs is now easier and you won't need a timetable.
- More frequent services on the Western and Northern lines will improve connection times at Town Hall for eastern suburbs customers travelling on to key business hubs such as Macquarie Park and Parramatta.
- More frequent connections to Sydney Airport with eight services per hour operating from Central to the airport during the day.

Clock-face services at many stations

Customers can simply turn up at the station and check the clock, knowing a train will be leaving every 10 minutes from the first service of the day right up until midnight.

Examples:

Bondi Junction to city



Kings Cross to city



AM peak = trains arrive at Central between 6am and 10am, Monday to Friday.
PM peak = trains depart Central between 3pm and 7pm, Monday to Friday.
