Inner West Line train timetable

The NSW Government will implement a new timetable on 20 October 2013. It's a major rewrite of the timetable and has been designed to improve the customer experience.

The new timetable will deliver more services, improve connections between different modes of public transport and reduce many journey times.

The timetable will also be easier for customers to use, with fewer stopping patterns and more consistent service times, particularly in peak periods.

Customers who travel longer distances from outer suburban areas will notice fewer stops and reduced journey times in many instances.

Customers closer to the CBD will receive frequent, more evenly spaced services, with many stations receiving 'turn up and go' services.

The train timetable will provide customers using the Inner West Line with:


- A new stopping pattern the Inner West Line will now run between Homebush and the city, with services stopping at all stations between.
- A frequent service to and from the city.
- Inner West services will now start from a dedicated turnback at Homebush. Previously, Inner West services would undertake complicated merges with other lines.
- 15-minute clock-face services at all stations between 6am and 10pm on weekdays.
- Improved reliability with the new \$102 million Homebush and Lidcombe turnbacks, which separates the Bankstown and Inner West lines, minimising the impact of disruptions elsewhere on the network.
- Improved connections between Inner West stations, tailored to meet the needs of local residents who want regular, frequent trains connecting schools and local centres. Under the previous timetable customers had service gaps of up to 24 minutes.
- An expanded service span with trains operating every 15 minutes from 6am (and as early as 5am at some stations) to 10pm, and at a lesser frequency beyond 10pm.
- For Newtown station, 15-minute service frequency extended to operate until midnight on weekdays, which is good for customers travelling home after a night out.
