Foreshore protection works

**We're working in your area from 10 April 2017 to 15 June 2018.
Here's what you need to know.**

What we're doing

Sydney Trains is undertaking foreshore protection work north of Hawkesbury Bridge at Wondabyne from Monday 10 April 2017 to Friday 15 June 2018.

We're constructing a 600-metre long rock armour wall to protect sections of the foreshore against erosion.

The wall will be approx. 3 metres high with the top of wall being level with riverbank. It will be constructed using large boulders.

We understand that this work will have an impact on you and your neighbours. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

How this affects you

Noise

These works may create additional noise. We apologise for the inconvenience this may cause.

Work will take place on weekdays between Monday 10 April 2017 and Friday 15 June 2018. Working hours will be from 6am to 6pm.

Finishing works will take place following this period, including the removal of equipment.

The work will coincide with tidal flows (working only at high tide).

Protection of the Environment

Silt curtains will be installed and maintained around the worksite to protect the local environment. Water quality monitoring will also be undertaken in accordance with Sydney Trains procedures.

Navigational markers

As required by RMS Waterways, navigational markers will be in place to direct waterway traffic during the construction works. The markers will ensure all vessels are aware of the changes in the channel.

No public access

As the Wondabyne foreshore is part of the rail corridor, access to this area, both during and after these works, is restricted to authorised railway personnel.

Parking

While we will park our vehicles inside the rail corridor wherever possible, please be aware that on-street parking may be limited near worksites.

Deliveries

Equipment may be delivered to the site outside of the times indicated. Due to travel restrictions on large vehicles, some deliveries may need to occur at night.

Truck movements

The work will involve several truck movements each day. Speed restrictions and water carts will be used to control dust emissions on Dangar Road.

During higher volumes of traffic, additional traffic control will be in place at the Dangar Road intersection near Hawkesbury River Station.
