

Night work on the Princes Highway from Thursday 12 May

The NSW Government is upgrading the Princes Highway between Berry and Bomaderry to improve safety, increase road capacity and improve traffic flow.

What are we doing?

Night work will continue to be carried out on the Princes Highway to complete line marking and maintenance works across the length of the construction corridor. The work is being carried out at night for the safety of workers and road users and to avoid extended traffic delays during the day. The work will occur across both carriageways of the Princes Highway up to the project's boundary.

Work will take place from **Thursday 12 May to Friday 3 June between 6pm and 6am**, weather permitting. Up to five nights of work will be carried out each week with no more than two consecutive nights at one location.

Should this work need to be postponed, new dates will be advertised on variable message signs along the highway and on the project website.

How will the work affect you?

During work hours, traffic will be diverted onto the opposite carriageway. Access in and out of local roads may also be restricted and temporary detours will be provided. Residents will be informed in advance of any changes to access at local roads.

A map showing the site wide line marking and maintenance to be completed is provided over the page.
