Project update – intersection improvement

The NSW Government has funded this project as part of its \$225 million Pinch Point Program, which aims to reduce traffic delays, manage congestion and improve travel times on Sydney's major roads

Roads and Maritime Services has improved the intersection of Bigge Street and the Hume Highway in Warwick Farm.

Open to traffic

The improvements were opened to traffic on Friday 24 November.

The completed work includes:

- a 90 metre long northbound left turn lane on Bigge Street
- two southbound right turn lanes on Bigge Street
- a westbound left turn lane on the Hume Highway
- No Stopping zones on Bigge Street and Hume Highway.

We will be returning to the site in January to carry out some minor work and remove the site compound.

Key benefits

The key benefits to the community include:

- improved traffic flow along the Hume Highway corridor
- increased efficiency and safety of the intersection
- reduced risk of crashes, particularly rear end crashes
- reduced queuing and waiting times for vehicles turning from Bigge Street onto the Hume Highway east and westbound.

Our work schedule

We will be onsite for another **six day shifts** and **six night shifts** between **Monday 8 January** and **Friday 15 January**, weather permitting. Our night work hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Friday**. Our day work hours will be between **7am** and **6pm** from **Saturday** to **Friday**.
