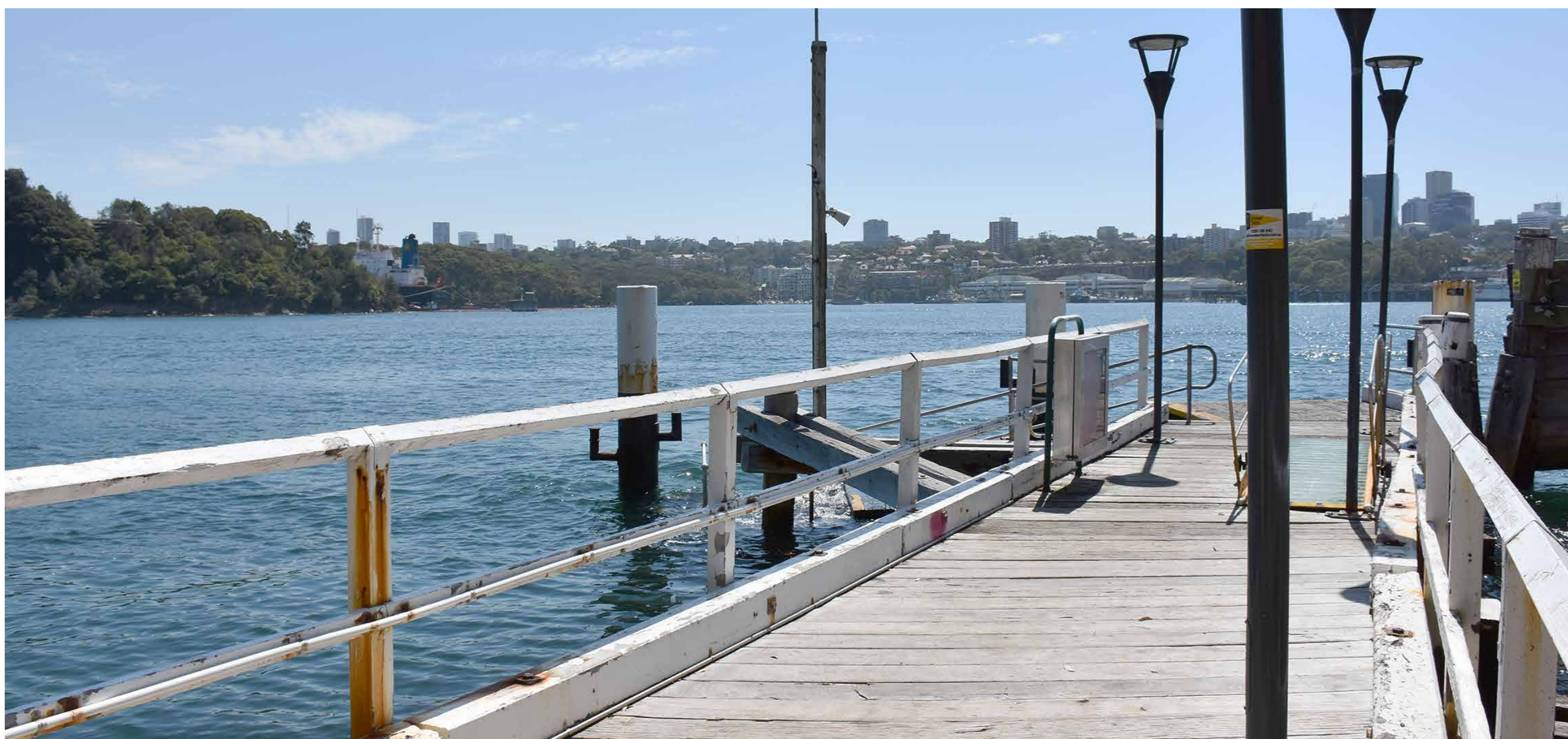


Birchgrove Wharf upgrade

OVERVIEW

August 2017

The NSW Government is upgrading Birchgrove Wharf as part of the Transport Access Program.

The proposed upgrade of Birchgrove Wharf is part of a wider program of transport improvements for the Parramatta River, with upgraded wharves, new ferries and increased ferry services planned for the area.

Transport for NSW is improving Sydney's ferry services for customers. New and upgraded wharves and interchanges are being delivered as part of the NSW Government's Transport Access Program. This program has most recently delivered upgraded facilities at Meadowbank, McMahons Point and Chiswick. Work is currently underway at Cockatoo Island Wharf and Milsons Point Wharf.

The Birchgrove Wharf upgrade would provide:

- ▶ better protection from the wind, rain and sun
- ▶ improved seating and waiting areas
- ▶ improved safety for customers
- ▶ quicker and more efficient ferry boarding and disembarking
- ▶ effective wayfinding signage and lighting.

Following consultation and feedback in March 2017 the Review of Environmental Factors has been prepared and will be displayed for community feedback from **Monday 21 August** to **Monday 11 September 2017**.

Construction is expected to start in the last quarter of 2017 following careful consideration of all feedback received and approval of final plans. Work to upgrade the wharf would take about five months to complete, weather and maritime conditions permitting.
