

Start of work at intersection of Brisbane Water Drive, Jirrah Avenue and Koolinda Avenue, Point Clare from Monday 25 November

The NSW Government is investing \$5.3 million to carry out safety improvements at this location.

Roads and Maritime Services is setting up the project compound and stockpile site, as well as clearing trees in preparation for traffic lights to be installed at the intersection of Brisbane Water Drive, Jirrah Avenue and Koolinda Avenue. This project is part of a broader program of work addressing safety issues along this section of Brisbane Water Drive.

We will be working between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday** and between **8am** and **1pm** on **Saturday**. Some work will be carried out between **6pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Thursday**.

No work will be carried out between **Saturday 21 December 2019** and **Sunday 5 January 2020**.

Main construction work for the traffic lights is expected to start in **early 2020**. We will notify you in advance of this work starting.

We have included a map to show the location of this project, which involves:

- installing traffic lights and pedestrian crossings at the intersection of Brisbane Water Drive, Jirrah Avenue and Koolinda Avenue
- widening Brisbane Water Drive to two lanes on the east side of the intersection and providing a new bus bay. The majority of widening would be within the existing road corridor but the project will require widening of the road reserve by about two metres into Fagan Park to provide a pedestrian path
- removing the mid-block pedestrian crossing on Brisbane Water Drive about 60 metres west of the intersection
- moving two bus stops near the intersection to a new designated bus bay near Fagan Park
- removing a small number of trees on the edge of Fagan Park and others next to the intersection within the road reserve
- changing no stopping zones around the intersection, including implementing a new no stopping zone on the south side of Brisbane Water Drive
- installing new pedestrian paths and kerb and gutter along Brisbane Water Drive east of the intersection, about 100 metres on the north side to the new bus bay and about 150 metres down the south side of the widened road.

How will the work affect you?

The work involves the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise impact, by turning machinery off when not in use and positioning stationary equipment away from nearby properties.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place during work hours and a 40km/h speed limit will be in place for the duration of the work. Motorists should allow extra travel time.
