## Road safety improvement works at Carlisle Avenue and Luxford Road intersection at Mount Druitt continuing from 2 August

July 2022

The Australian Government and NSW Governments are investing more than \$400 million to improve safety and reduce crashes on NSW roads.

Transport for NSW will install new signalised pedestrian crossings at the intersection of Carlisle Avenue and Luxford Road as part of the Roads Safety Stimulus Program. This will increase safety for pedestrians and road users and will help to efficiently regulate traffic flows.

The wet weather has caused delays in our construction activities. As a result, we expect our work to be completed by 28 August instead of 1 August as previously notified.

### Key features

- three new signalised pedestrian crossings: Luxford Road slip lane turning onto Carlisle Avenue (1), Carlisle Avenue slip lane turning onto Luxford Road (2), Carlisle Avenue slip lane turning onto Luxford Road (3)
- new concrete pram ramps
- new line markings and road signs
- removal of western median nose to allow smoother turns for large vehicles.



## Our work schedule

We will be on site for 11 night shifts between Tuesday 2 August and 28 August, weather permitting. Our night work hours are 8pm and 5am Sunday to Friday.

We have planned the work schedule so the upgrades can be completed as quickly as possible, limiting the impact on road users and the local community.

## How will the work affect you?

This work may be noisy at times, but we will do everything we can to lessen the disturbance, including completing the noisier activities, like jack hammering and saw cutting, by 11 pm.

## Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Some work will need to be carried out at night to limit traffic disruption and reduce safety risks to workers and motorists. Lane closures may be in place at night and may affect travel times.
