



## Construction update

#### **Chandos Street Noise Wall**

# The Chandos Street Noise Wall will help reduce traffic noise for nearby residents between St Thomas' Rest Park and Brook Street, Crows Nest.

We are now over half way through building the noise wall and we would like to thank you for your patience with our work and the disruption this may have caused. Over the past few months we decreased the amount of night work by nine nights to help minimise the impact on you. We also relocated services including Telstra cables and completed building the noise wall footings and posts.

Currently infrastructure construction projects are considered essential to the economy and will continue as planned across the city and the state.

The safety and wellbeing of our workforce and the wider community is our highest priority. Our people are following hygiene and appropriate social distancing measures and will continue to do so.

We will continue to write to you every three months to provide an update on our work.

#### What work will be carried out?

Between **Monday 4 May and Sunday 26 July 2020**, we will be carrying out work from St Thomas' Rest Park to Brook Street, including installing noise wall panels, building retaining walls and start landscaping areas where our work has impacted vegetation.

We will need to occasionally access Atchison Street between Alexander Street and St Thomas' Rest Park (including Matthew Lane) from **Monday 20 April** to Friday 29 May 2020 to deliver materials and machinery to our site. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times and traffic control will direct vehicles when machinery movements occur.

We have provided a map over the page to help identify the location of this work.

#### Our work schedule

We will be working through the day and up to 10 nights over the next three months, to build the noise wall as quickly as possible.

We will carry out our work between:

- 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday
- 8am and 1pm Saturdays
- 8pm and 5am Sunday to Friday.

No work will be carried out on public holidays.

It is difficult for us to confirm the exact nights we will be working during this period because of the weather and the approvals we need to be able to work on the road.
