
Investigation work in Macquarie Park from Wednesday 3 July

Macquarie Park is a rapidly growing residential, commercial and shopping district, needing long-term bus and road improvements to support the area's future growth.

Roads and Maritime Services will carry out investigation work as part of the Bus Priority Infrastructure Program. This program aims to improve the reliability and efficiency of bus services, while easing congestion for all road users.

Investigation work will take place in Macquarie Park along Epping Road, Herring Road, Waterloo Road, Lane Cove Road and some side roads. The work will include surveying, potholing and cutting the road surface and footpaths to investigate underground utilities and ground conditions.

The investigations will help inform the design for Stage 2 of the Macquarie Park Bus Priority and Capacity Improvement project.



Our work schedule

We will be on site for up to 20 day shifts and 55 night shifts between Wednesday 3 July to Monday 30 September 2019, weather permitting.

Our day work hours will be between 7am to 6pm from **Monday** to **Friday** and **8am** to **1pm** on Saturday.

Our **night** work hours will be between **8pm** to 5am from Sunday to Friday.

How the work will affect you

We will be working up to five nights a week. Our work will progress along the street and will not take place in the same location for more than three nights in a row.

Our work may be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing the noisier activities such as concrete cutting, drilling and jack hammering by midnight.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

What is the Bus Priority Infrastructure Program

The Bus Priority Infrastructure Program delivers infrastructure that make bus services more reliable and efficient, such as bus lanes, increasing capacity and bus priority at intersections or more effective bus stop placement.

Buses are a key part of Sydney's growing and evolving public transport network. Sydney's buses provide more than 220 million trips a year across the city. As Sydney grows, the bus system needs to meet the challenges growth brings.
