



Macquarie Park Community Update

Transport for NSW | November 2022

The Australian and NSW Governments are investing in Macquarie Park to improve public transport and the road network.

Transport for NSW will finish its main improvement works on Herring Road by late December 2022 to provide a dedicated northbound bus lane and upgrade three Herring Road intersections at Epping Road, Ivanhoe Place and Waterloo Road.

Our work will improve the reliability and efficiency of bus services, reduce travel times, ease congestion, and make it easier to travel to, around and from Macquarie Park.

What have we achieved?

- We replaced the roundabout with traffic lights at the Herring Road and Ivanhoe Place intersection
- We installed a new watermain along Herring Road between Windsor Drive and Waterloo Road
- We built new footpath and pram ramps at the Epping Road and Herring Road intersection
- We installed new garden beds and planted new shrubbery and trees at the Herring Road and Ivanhoe Place intersection.

What's next?

Weather permitting, throughout November to Friday 23 December, we expect to complete most of our remaining work. However, we may need to continue working up to five nights a week, excluding the Christmas holiday break, until late February, to finish any minor works such as the final landscaping and line marking.


To complete the work we will:

- Complete the final layer of road resurfacing along the entire project alignment
- Finish installing the granite pavers at the Herring Road and Waterloo Road intersection
- Install and turn on the last of the new traffic lights at the Waterloo Road and Herring Road intersection
- Install new permanent line marking and road signage
- Finish the last of the landscaping in completed areas

With the holiday season upon us, to give the community and our workers a break, we will not be doing any work from Friday 23

December to Saturday 7 January 2023, unless we get called out for an emergency.

Wettest year ever... just let that soak in for a moment

You may have noticed that our notifications say that works will go ahead, weather permitting. This is because construction work relies heavily on dry weather to progress according to its schedule. With Sydney recording its wettest year on record with a total of 2,200mm of rain and more rain to come, construction work across the city has been significantly delayed.

Wet weather can impact construction work in many ways. It affects the drying time of concrete and asphalt. It can also damage the materials being used, making them less durable and effective. Wet weather can also create safety hazards for workers and the community when doing certain activities. For example, excavating in the rain has the potential to cause incidents like trenches caving in.

The Herring Road Improvements project has been impacted by this year's wet weather, delaying our schedule significantly. We are working hard to get the work done despite the forecast of rain in the next few months. We thank you for your ongoing patience and understanding during this time.

40 new traffic signal poles



We have recycled **3, 200 tonnes of concrete**

1,300 plants, shrubs and trees



We have laid **3, 350 sq metres of footpath**

Our work schedule

We need to work at night to lessen traffic disruption and protect our workers and the public on these busy roads.

Our night work hours remain between **8pm** and **5am** on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights.

We work hard to reduce noise as much as possible by stopping our noisiest work by midnight. These noisy activities include sawcutting, jack hammering and the breaking up of concrete. Other less noisy, activities can continue until 5am. These activities can include the sucking of a vacuum truck and the digging from an excavator.

Road resurfacing is another activity that can continue after midnight. We will continue to resurface the widened Herring Road between Epping Road and Waterloo Road. This activity can be loud as we use equipment like profilers, which grind away at the old road surface.

Ways we try to reduce noise for the community are by:

- Using noise blankets around equipment where possible
- Selecting less noisy equipment
- Switching off equipment when not in use
- Monitoring our construction noise levels

Traffic changes

Temporary footpath and lane closures will be in place to ensure the work zone is safe. This may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

Asbestos removal

There may be the possibility that asbestos is found as we near project completion.

To make sure there is no risk to the community and our workers we will continue to:

- Follow an asbestos management plan that details safe work practices
- Make sure the asbestos does not present an immediate safety risk
- Follow all Environment Protection Authority and SafeWork NSW requirements for removal of asbestos material
- Maintain strict safety precautions during the removal including workers wearing protective suits and masks and the work area being isolated with safety fences and asbestos warning signs
- Send the material to a licensed asbestos disposal facility


