Berry bypass community meeting

In August residents in Berry requested the RTA (now Roads and Maritime Services – RMS) improve the design of the highway proposed to the north of Berry. We agreed.

RMS will now hold a community meeting at 7.00pm on **Tuesday 6 December 2011** to discuss the changes.

Venue: The Berry School of Arts, 19 Alexandra Street, Berry.

Time: Cuppa at 6.30pm, meeting start at 7.00pm and finish at 8.30pm (light supper provided).

Everyone is welcome.

Changes to the alignment have been developed through debate and discussion with residents in a community review group (described on the project website). The revised bypass alignment will have reduced noise and visual impacts for the town of Berry. These improvements have been achieved by shifting the road north and lowering it at key locations.

- The bridge has been moved approximately 95 metres further away from Berry as it crosses Woodhill Mountain Road.
- The bridge has been lowered by up to 6.4 metres.
- The bridge will not need noise barriers, reducing the visual impact of the structure.
- Along North Street the bypass has been moved further north, using the original road reserve as a 40 metre buffer between Alexandra and Edward Streets.
- Along North Street the bypass has been lowered by up to two metres between Alexandra Street and George Street, reducing the visual impacts of noise walls.

The changed alignment will be on display at the Berry project office located at Broughton Court, shop 3/113 Queen Street, Berry. The project office will be open during this display period from

Thursday 1 December to Wednesday 14 December 2011:

- 10am to 5pm Monday to Friday (extended to 8pm on Wednesday 7 December 2011).
- 10am to 2pm Saturdays.

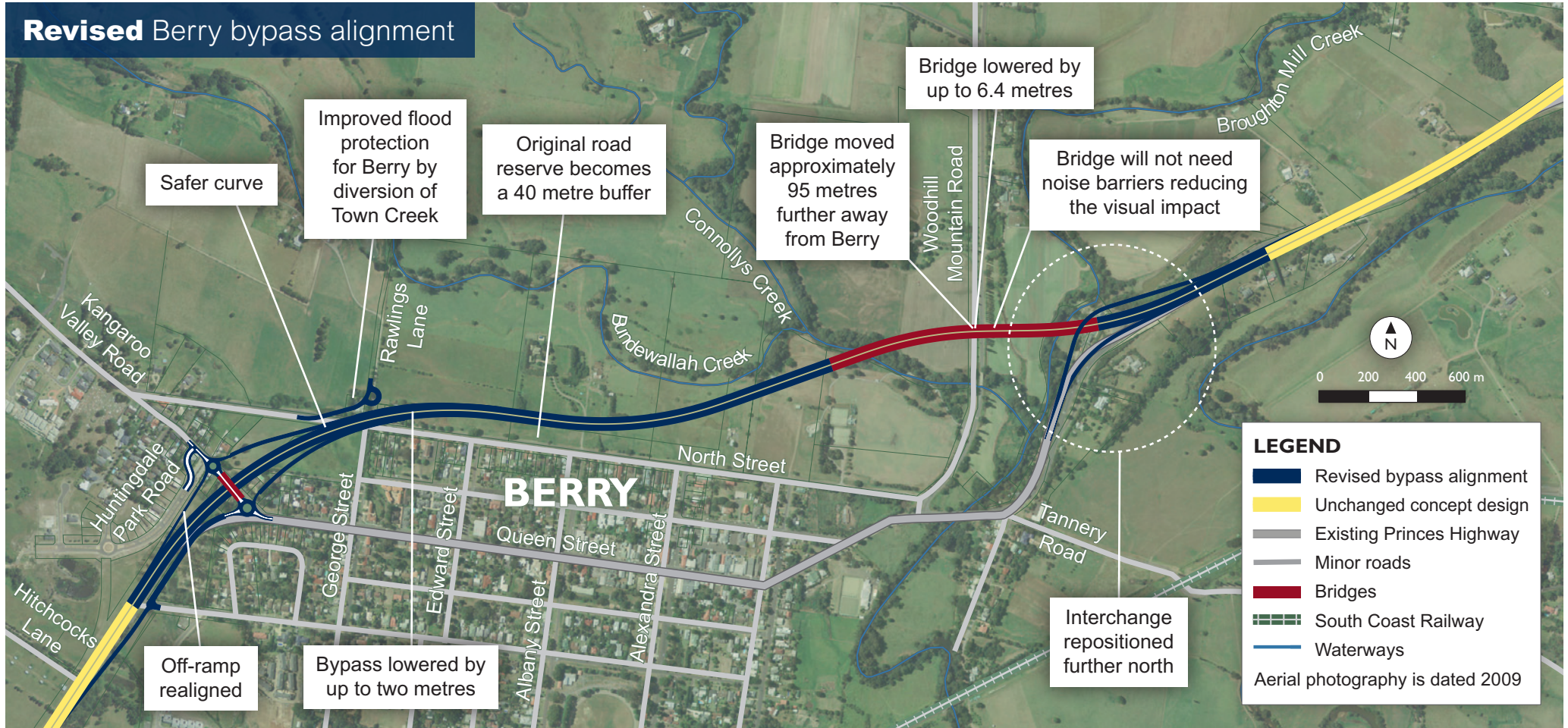
