

Detour and changed traffic conditions on the Great Western Highway, Raglan, from Monday 21 February

The NSW Government is investing \$45 million to upgrade the Great Western Highway between Kelso and Raglan near Bathurst.

Transport for NSW will carry out the important upgrade work which involves excavation for a watermain relocation. We have included a map to show the location of the work and the detour.

Work is expected to take **two weeks** to complete from **8am on Monday 21 February** weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside of this time.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Access to Eugenie Street from the Great Western Highway will be closed for a period of two weeks, with a detour in place via Nile Street, **until 5pm on Friday 4 March**. Intermittent stopping and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place during work hours, between **7am and 6pm**, from **Monday to Friday**.

Access to Eugenie Street between the Great Western Highway and Christie Street will be for residents only.

Motorists are advised to drive to the conditions and obey signs and traffic control. Allow extra travel time.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

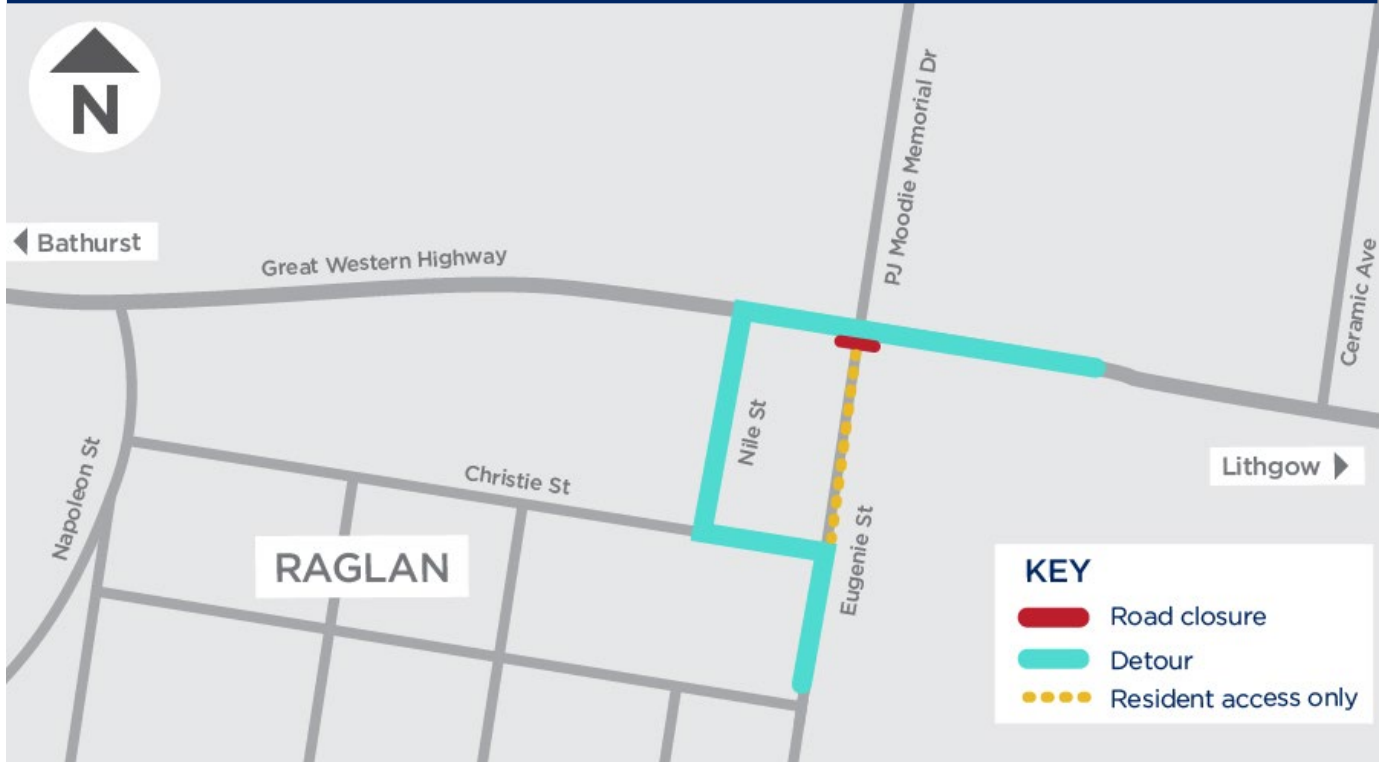
