



Tree removal on the Great Western Highway at Raglan on Wednesday 6 April

The NSW Government is funding this \$45 million upgrade of the Great Western Highway between Kelso and Raglan. Tree removal will be taking place approximately 800m east of Ashworth Drive.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work, which includes the removal of up to fifteen poplar trees on the southern side of the Great Western Highway to allow for utility relocation. We have included a map to show you the location of work.

We will be working between **7pm** and **12am** and expect to complete the work in one night, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

Transport for NSW has consulted with Bathurst City Council and Greening Bathurst ahead of the trees being removed. A detailed landscape design plan and artists impression showing the future plantings is available to view on our website nswroads.work/kelsotoraglan.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Intermittent stopping and a reduced speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Motorists should allow extra travel time during this work.
