

Work completed at Hoxton Park Road and Joadja Road, Hoxton Park

Transport for NSW has completed this project to help ease congestion and improve travel times and safety for road users.



The newly upgraded Hoxton Park Road and Joadja Road intersection in Hoxton Park.

Motorists and local residents in Hoxton Park and surrounding areas were experiencing heavy congestion in the morning and evening peak hours caused by traffic turning into Joadja Road.

Transport for NSW has completed upgrading this 'pinch point' intersection and since opening to traffic in August 2020, the upgrade is delivering more reliable trips for all road users.

Thank you to the local community for your patience while we completed this intersection upgrade.



What we did

Our work included:

- constructing an additional eastbound right turn lane from Hoxton Park Road into Joadja Road
- signalising the left turn slip lane at the pedestrian crossing from Hoxton Park Road into Joadja Road
- modifying the median islands and storm water drainage
- replacing asphalt
- relocating traffic lights and utilities to suit the new configuration.

Community benefits

The intersection upgrade is helping:

- ease congestion and improve traffic flow for road users along Hoxton Park Road and Joadja Road, particularly during peak periods
- reduce travel times for local residents and commuters
- improve access to and from Liverpool CBD and the M7 Motorway
- · improve safety for all road users.



What is a 'pinch point'?

A pinch point is a traffic congestion point, either at an intersection or on a short length of road, where a traffic bottleneck exists. They cause traffic build-up and travel delays at these spots and on the wider road network.

More than \$825 million has been committed to the pinch point program. Each project will ease congestion, reduce traffic delays and improve travel times on Sydney's major roads.
