

## Night work and out of hours work at Highfields and Adamstown Heights, from Monday 10 January 2022

The NSW Government is investing \$13.5 million from the Hunter Pinch Points Program to improve traffic flow and safety on City Road.

Transport for NSW has awarded a contract to Robson Civil to carry out the City Road (Pacific Highway) intersection upgrades at Kahibah Road and Northcott Drive. Work started in early August 2021 and we expect to complete the project by late 2022, weather permitting.

To minimise traffic disruptions, and to ensure the safety of workers and road users, some of the work will be carried out at night and outside standard working hours.

Night work will be carried out within the project area from **Monday 10 January 2022**. We will be working between **6pm** and **7am** from **Monday to Friday** for **two months**, weather permitting.

From **Monday 10 January** to **Friday 25 February**, we will also be carrying out work on **Saturday** between **8am** and **5pm**, weather permitting.

We will continue to deliver the majority of the work between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday to Friday**, and between **8am** and **1pm** on **Saturday**, weather permitting.

Work will be carried out at the intersection of City Road (Pacific Highway) and Kahibah Road and the intersection of City Road (Pacific Highway) and Northcott Drive. The work will include:

- installing and removing temporary barriers and kerbs
- earthworks for new pavements
- removing road surfaces
- asphalt road resurfacing
- line marking
- median traffic island construction
- kerb construction
- concrete works
- saw-cutting pavements
- stormwater drainage
- piling and installation of retaining wall posts
- installation of pre-cast concrete panels
- overhead electrical upgrades
- upgrading traffic lights

### How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates noise, light and vibration. We will make every effort to minimise any potential noise impacts by, using a limited amount of machinery together at any given time. Machines will be shielded, where possible, and turned off when not in use. All machines are fitted with reversing squawkers rather than beepers to reduce noise impacts. Lighting towers will be directed away from residents. Noisier activities will be carried out before 10pm wherever possible.

### Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe, including a 40km/h speed limit at all times.

From **Monday 10 January**, single lane closure of the southbound slow lane on City Road will be in place for **five weeks**, weather permitting. Motorists should allow extra travel time. Traffic will be monitored and alternative changes to traffic conditions will be made as required.

Traffic control will be implemented, at times, to upgrade traffic signals and systems.

The bus stop on City Road within the work zone (map below) will be temporarily relocated to the northern end of the work zone.
