

New alternative business customer parking at Beverly Hills for new and extended clearways

Parked vehicles on King Georges Road causing congestion

The NSW Government is funding this project as part of its \$121 million Clearways Program, which aims to reduce congestion and delays on Sydney's roads.

From **2 December 2019**, new weekend and extended weekday clearways will be operational on King Georges Road through Beverly Hills between the M5 Motorway and Stoney Creek Road.

The clearway hours will operate in both directions on King Georges Road from:

- **6am to 7pm on weekdays**
- **9am to 6pm on weekends and public holidays.**

Engagement outcome

In June 2019 Roads and Maritime Services invited feedback from businesses and the community on proposed alternative business customer parking for the new and extended clearways on King Georges Road through Beverly Hills between the M5 Motorway and Stoney Creek Road.

We received feedback from businesses and the local community in Beverly Hills concerning business customer parking and the proposed angle parking in Hampden Street. We thank everyone who provided feedback.

After considering the feedback received, Roads and Maritime will be working with Georges River Council to deliver alternative business customer parking to support new weekend and extended weekday clearways on King Georges Road. Details on the new alternative business customer parking are provided overleaf.

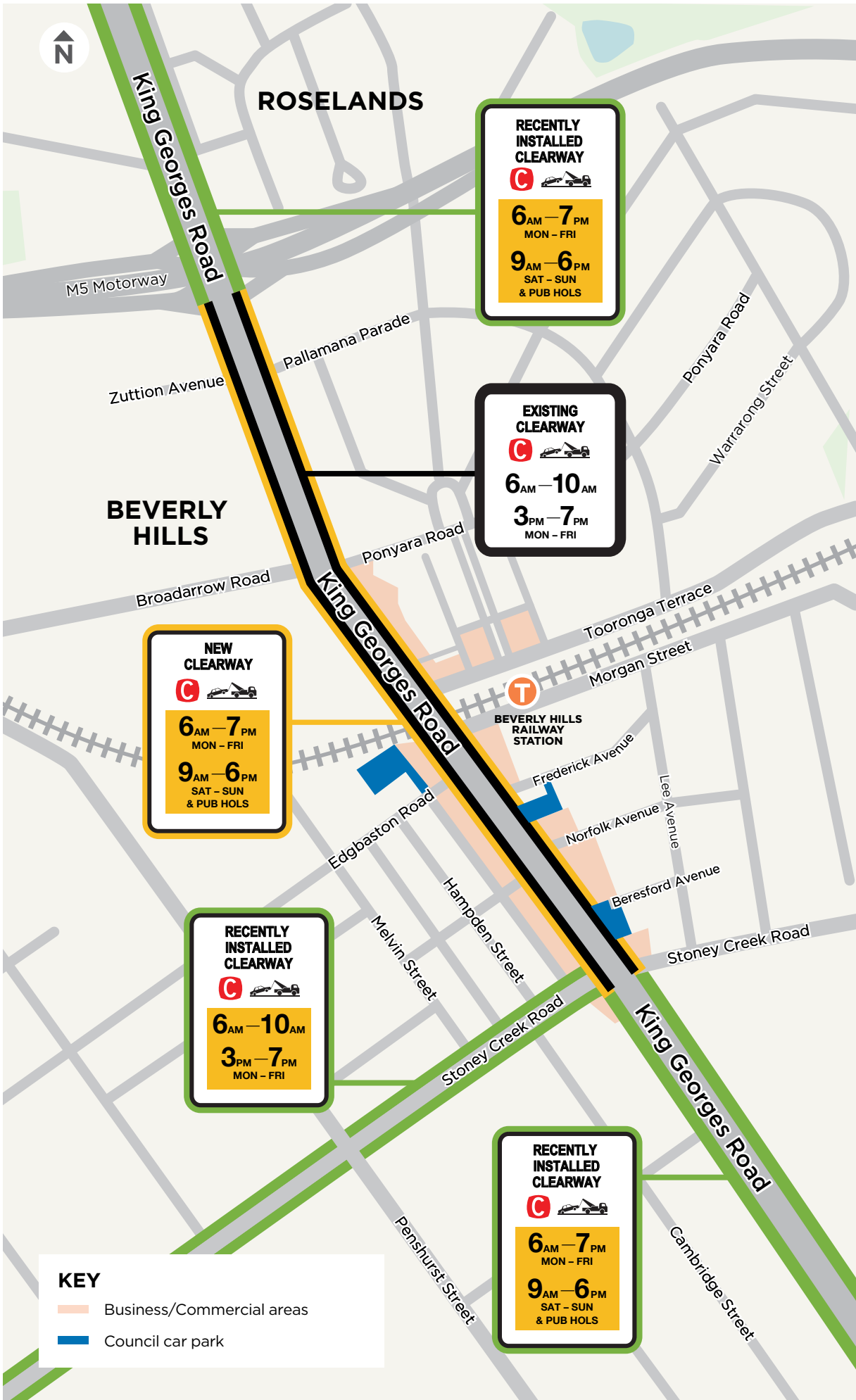
We also considered feedback from the community about the proposed new angle parking on Hampden Street and pedestrian footpath improvements in the laneway that connects Hampden Street to King Georges Road. After listening to feedback received and further discussions with Georges River Council, it was agreed that this element of the proposal will not proceed.

New alternative business customer parking

With funding from Roads and Maritime, Georges River Council will be upgrading the council car parks on Beresford Avenue and Frederick Avenue, including new asphalt surface, line marking, wheel stops and parking signage.

More spaces in Beresford Avenue car park

In the Beresford Avenue car park:

- A new parking layout will see an additional 4 parking spaces created
- 11 3P spaces will be converted to 1P to provide more short term parking for business customers during clearways hours
- Relocation of the existing accessible (disabled) parking space next to the footpath for easier access to shops.

Short term parking in Frederick Avenue car park

In the Frederick Avenue car park, three of the 3P spaces will be converted to 1P to provide for more short term parking for business customers during clearways hours.

Even with the time changes in Beresford Avenue car park and Frederick Avenue car park, there will still be over 130 3P parking spaces available to business customers across the three Council car parks (including the Edgbaston Road car park) in Beverly Hills.

Parking on King Georges Road will still be allowed after 7pm on weekdays and 6pm on weekends and public holidays to support evening dining in the Beverly Hills Town Centre.

All other parking restrictions will remain unchanged outside the clearways hours.

Improved wayfinding signage

Roads and Maritime has also listened to feedback from businesses and the community regarding the need for better wayfinding signs to council car parks. We will continue to work with Georges River Council to improve the wayfinding signage so that customers can easily access the council car parks in the Beverly Hills Town Centre.

Key benefits

Clearways:

- reduce congestion by making an additional lane available to traffic
- improve journey times, allowing drivers to get to their destination sooner and more reliably
- improve safety by removing parked vehicles from the kerbside lane
- have an immediate positive impact on traffic flow as it uses existing road space for the movement of vehicles
- improve the efficiency of intersections along the corridor, as all lanes are used.



What happens next?

The new clearway signs and posts will be installed between **Monday 18 November and Sunday 1 December 2019**, weather permitting. Our working hours will be between 8pm and 5am from Monday to Sunday.

However, in Beverly Hills Town Centre between Morgan Street and Stoney Creek Road (southbound), and Stoney Creek Road and Edgbaston Road (northbound), installation works will happen **from 10pm to 5am on weekdays and 11pm to 5am on weekends**. This is to minimise the impact on parking and businesses during the evening business trading hours.

The new clearways will be operational from **6am Monday 2 December 2019**, in conjunction with Georges River Council completing the upgrades in Frederick Avenue car park and Beresford Avenue car park.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise associated with this work but we will do everything we can to minimise the impact, including completing noisier tasks by midnight.

During the installation work, there will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

Background

The NSW Government announced the Sydney Clearways Strategy as one of its key initiatives to reduce congestion on Sydney's major roads. \$121 million was committed to implementing the strategy and installing new clearways on Sydney's road network.

Installing new and extended clearways on weekdays and weekends can help reduce congestion in many areas of Sydney by allowing motorists to use all traffic lanes.

Since 2013, we have installed more than 650 kilometres of new and extended clearways across some of Sydney's busiest road corridors. We are continuing to investigate where new and extended clearways would help ease congestion and provide more reliable travel times for road users across the network.
