

Kingsford to Centennial Park walking and cycling improvements

Temporary work, traffic changes and detour at Doncaster Avenue

The Australian and NSW Governments are delivering walking and cycling improvements to provide an active transport link between Kingsford and Centennial Park.

Upcoming work

From Sunday **22 January 2023**, we are commencing work on Doncaster Avenue, between **Koorinda Avenue and Day Avenue, Kensington**. We recently notified you of this work, but this has been rescheduled and we apologise for any inconvenience caused.

This work will involve tree removal, new stormwater drainage, footpaths, kerbs, gutters and driveways.

This temporary traffic change will be the second of three traffic changes on this section of Doncaster Avenue and will occur on the night of **22 January 2023**.

In the next few weeks, we will also be implementing a detour at the intersection of Doncaster and Day Avenue so that we can safely complete the stormwater installation. **We will send a separate notification confirming the date and duration of the detour.**

The map shows our work area, temporary traffic arrangement and detour (when in place) to complete this work.


The work has been planned this way to minimise parking impacts while we carry out this work.

Parking changes

Prior to the **22 January 2023**, we need to temporarily remove approximately **38 parking spaces** between Koorinda Avenue and Day Avenue, to complete this work. The traffic change will take place at night.

Parking will be removed on both sides of the road and we will add linemarking to direct traffic around our work zone.

We will also temporarily remove approximately **10 parking spaces** near the intersection of

Doncaster Avenue and Day Avenue in preparation for the detour and stormwater works.

We are working with Randwick City Council to provide **21 off-set resident permit parking spaces** on Koorinda Avenue and Day Avenue. The map shows the locations of these temporary parking arrangements.

These parking spaces and original traffic arrangement will be reinstated once this work is complete.

Traffic detour

To continue our stormwater drainage work, the northern end of the intersection at Doncaster Avenue and Day Avenue will be temporarily closed. A separate notification will be distributed confirming the date and duration of the detour.

Access to properties will be maintained for local residents. Resident access will be via Doncaster Avenue near the intersection of Koorinda Avenue as shown on the map.

The detour will be in place to ensure the safety of road users, pedestrians and our workers. The map shows the road closure locations and planned detour routes.

Work hours

Our day work hours are from 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 7.30am to 3.30pm on Saturdays.

There may also be some out of hours work associated with the stormwater installation.

If night work is required, our work hours will be from 7pm to 5am. Local residents will be notified in advance of any night work.

Work is dependent on weather and site conditions and is subject to change.

Minimising community impact

Our work activities will require the use of machinery that generates noise and vibration. Equipment used for these activities include saw-cutter, excavator, concrete truck, compaction equipment, vacuum truck and excavators.

When working out of hours, we will also use mobile lighting towers.

To minimise the impact of this work we will:

- monitor noise periodically so we can manage any potential impacts and adjust our work as required
- fit equipment with devices to minimise noise, particularly non-tonal reversing beepers

In addition, at night we will also:

- complete the noisiest activities such as saw-cutting and jackhammering by midnight
- direct temporary lighting down and away from houses
- turn off machinery when not in use
- use noise blankets to minimise noise, where feasible.

We will work with residents in close proximity to these works to minimise impacts. All work will be carried out in line with project environmental approvals.

Traffic and pedestrian changes

There will be traffic changes in place during our work to ensure the work zone is safe which may affect travel times.

There may be partial footpath closures near our work area and alternative path and signs will be in place.

Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controller directions.
