Changed traffic conditions on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road, Kooragang, from Monday 23 October 2017

The Australian and NSW governments have each committed funding for this project to improve traffic flow and cater for future traffic growth.

Roads and Maritime Services has engaged the WBHO McIlwain Joint Venture to duplicate 3.8 kilometres of Tourle Street and Cormorant Road between Industrial Drive, Mayfield West and Egret Street, Kooragang including construction of a second bridge over the Hunter River.

Upcoming work includes:

- removing existing line markings on the road and replacing with new line markings
- installing medians and wire rope safety barriers
- bridge construction including delivery and installation of bridge beams, and concrete pours on piers and decks at the Hunter River
- delivery of large items including bridge beams on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road
- road construction and resurfacing activities on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road
- utilities, drainage and concreting activities on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road.

During the week starting **Monday 23 October**, all traffic travelling along Cormorant Road, between the Tourle Street bridge and the Newcastle Coal Infrastructure Group entrance, will be shifted onto the newly built sections of road. This traffic switch is required to allow work to be carried out on the existing road and is expected to remain in place for about **three months**, weather permitting.

We will continue to deliver the majority of work between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday**, weather permitting. There is a need to do some occasional work at night, outside of standard hours, between **6pm** and **7am** from **Sunday** to **Friday** and between **7am** and **6pm** on **Saturday**. This is to minimise traffic disruptions and maintain worker and motorist safety.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by:

- arranging the work at different locations
- using the minimum amount of machinery necessary and turning the machinery off when not in use
- monitoring worker behaviour to ensure noise is kept to a minimum.

Traffic changes

Temporary traffic changes will continue to be in place to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.
