

Linden Street upgrade

Closure of the left turn into Galga Street | November 2022


Transport for NSW is upgrading Linden Street to reduce congestion and improve safety, traffic flow and journey reliability.

What's happening?

Closure of the left turn into Galga Street from Linden Street

From the week commencing Sunday 13 November the left turn into Galga Street from Linden Street will permanently close to allow room for the extra lane to be built. Vehicle access to Galga Street will be via Leonay Street and Oakwood Street.

An electronic message sign will advise the closure date in advance.



A pedestrian detour will also be in place until the new Galga Street cul-de-sac is built. Pedestrians can use the existing signalised crossings and footpaths on Linden Street, Leonay Street and Oakwood Street to join the footpath on River Road. Signage will be in place to guide pedestrians.

Cyclists can continue to use Leonay Street and Oakwood Street to access River Road.

Other work on the project

During November, work will also include:

- Continuing site survey work, geotechnical and utilities investigation on The Grand Parade, Oakwood Street, Leonay Street and Galga Street for additional local road improvements
- Continuing with the removal of concrete medians
- Continuing with the relocation of utilities
- Installing temporary safety barriers and site access, signage and traffic signals
- Removing existing kerb, footpaths, linemarking and pavement to widen the road
- Installing drainage.

How will the work impact me?

This work may be noisy at times. Equipment used may include lights, vehicles and trucks, generators, excavators, vacuum trucks and water carts, powered hand tools and lighting towers.

We will make every effort to minimise disruption by:

- Fitting equipment with devices to minimise noise, including reversing squawkers rather than beepers
- Using noise shields
- Turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use
- Directing temporary lighting down and away from homes
- Carrying out noisier activities, including jackhammering and saw cutting, earlier in the night, where possible
- Monitoring noise to manage impacts and adjust our work, where possible.

Working hours

Day work is carried out between **7am and 6pm Monday to Friday**, and between **8am and 1pm Saturday**.

Night work is carried out between **8pm and 5am Sunday to Thursday**.

Traffic changes

Temporary safety barriers will be installed, and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place to allow work to be carried out safely on the project.

Traffic changes when work is occurring may also include temporary lane and shoulder closures and intermittent stop/slow traffic control. Please observe traffic signs and traffic controllers' directions.
