

# Start of early work on M4 Motorway Roper Road westbound on-ramp from Friday 27 August 2021

The NSW Government is funding this project to ease congestion on the M4 Motorway on ramps and local roads within Erskine Park and St Clair.

The first stages of work will begin with early work of the project which will occur over a 12 week period from **27 August 2021**, weather permitting. During this period we will:

- commence early work in preparation for the main work
- remove vegetation
- install a drainage line
- remove and relocate existing utilities.

A site compound will be established at the end of Augusta Place, St Clair. The compound will be used for the duration of the early work, future main work and will be used to provide site offices, amenities for staff, deliveries and car parking. There will be another compound set up at the end of Shepherd Street, Colyton which will be used for a storage and stockpile area.

#### **Our Work Schedule**

We will work for around 67 day shifts between Friday 27 August to Friday 19 November 2021, weather permitting.

Work during the day will occur on weekdays between 7am to 6pm and Saturdays between 7am to 6pm in compliance with the Government's COVID Response and Recovery for construction sites and public infrastructure.

We may have to carry out some tasks at night outside of the standard construction hours. We shall notify you prior to this work commencing. These hours would be between 8pm to 5am.

### How will the work affect you?

There may be some disruption associated with this work including vehicle movements during the set up and use of this facility. Machinery and equipment used during the site construction may include trucks, rollers, concrete trucks and equipment, power generators, hand tools and light vehicles.

We will make every effort to minimise impact to the local community and motorists in the area. Access will be maintained at all times for local residents, should there be a requirement to need to limit access at any time residents will be notified prior.

## Traffic changes

During the early work there will be an increase in vehicle movements in and around the local streets however these will only be light vehicles and deliveries. Heavy vehicles will go directly to the work site areas only.

There may be some temporary lane closures during this work, we will notify residents and motorists closer to the date.
