Project update and temporary traffic changes on Main Road, Heddon Greta from Thursday 10 November

The NSW Government is funding a road upgrade from near Young Street to near Trenchard Street to improve traffic flow and safety as traffic volumes increase.

Transport for NSW is continuing work on the Main Road upgrade. The next stage of work involves moving motorists to the northern side of the road to allow our work area to relocate to the opposite side of the road.

We will be carrying out night work from **Thursday 10 November** to install new line marking and concrete barriers to shift the travel lanes. We will be working between **7pm** and **5am** and expect to complete the traffic changes in **two nights**, weather permitting.

The next stage of work will involve watermain and stormwater installation between Stanford Street and Heddon Street. This work will be carried out **Monday** to **Friday** between **7am** and **5pm** during November and December.

From Friday 23 December to Sunday 8 January the project site will be closed.

From **Monday 9 January**, road re-construction on the westbound lanes between Heddon Street and Young Street will be carried out. This work will be carried out **Monday** to **Friday** between **7am** and **5pm**. We will notify the community if any night work is required.

Due to the significant wet weather in recent months, the project has experienced some delays which has added several weeks to our work program. The project is now expected to be completed in **March 2023**, weather permitting.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. A 40km/h speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times.

Line marking and concrete barriers will direct motorists to the new travel lanes on the northern side of the road. The work area will move to the southern side of the road. We have included a diagram to show where the travel lanes will shift to.

These changes will involve opening Stanford Street on the northern side to left in and left out and closing Stanford Street on the southern side for this next stage of work.

Work will be staged to minimise impacts to parking and access to the shops and for local residents. There will be short periods of time during construction where access to the shop car park will be limited to staff, delivery vehicles and road users with limited mobility. We will continue to speak to shop owners about timing and duration of any short-term impacts. Kerbside parking will be maintained for customers on the road between the shops and Stanford Street.

During the holiday period from Friday 23 December to Sunday 8 January, the project site will be closed. During this time the shop car park will be open to all motorists and on street parking between Heddon Street and Stanford Street will be available.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by arranging the work in stages at different locations, completing noisier activities earlier in the night and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

We will speak with residents living in the work area on Main Road about any temporary impacts to access or parking as we progress along this next section of the road.
