

## Work continues on McKanes Bridge to reopen to traffic in November

The NSW Government is investing \$10 million to upgrade the McKanes Bridge over Coxs River on McKanes Falls Road at South Bowenfels to ensure the bridge can meet the current and future safe operational needs of the road network.



Transport for NSW is nearing completion of the upgrade to McKanes Bridge and will open to traffic at the end of November.

While the bridge will be open, Transport will remain on site after November to finish work including painting trusses, dismantling scaffolding, completing earthworks and landscaping. These activities are expected to be completed by April 2023, weather permitting.

### How will the work affect you?

After re-opening to traffic work will continue to be carried out beside the bridge and within the site compound.

Work will involve the use of machinery, which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by arranging the work in stages at different locations and turning off plant and machinery when not in use.

## Traffic changes

At the end of November McKanes Bridge will reopen to traffic.

After the bridge is open to traffic there will be a need for some of the final work activities to be carried out under traffic control during normal working hours.

Traffic control will be in place at McKanes Bridge approaches with 40km/h limit in operation during these work hours.
