

Nelligen Bridge Replacement – Traffic changes on the Kings Highway from Monday 14 February

The NSW Government is funding this \$148 million project which will provide a new bridge over the Clyde River and upgrades to the Kings Highway at Nelligen.

What are we doing?

Work will be carried out on the Kings Highway in Nelligen as we prepare to build the eastbound approach to the new Nelligen Bridge. This work includes excavating material, removing guardrail and installing temporary concrete barriers on the Kings Highway between Wharf and Reid streets.

When are we working?

This work will take place during standard work hours from **Monday 14 February until Friday 25 February**, weather permitting.

Our work hours are **Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm** and **Saturday between 8am and 1pm**.

We will advise the community in advance if these dates change due to weather or program impacts. These new dates will be advertised on roadside electronic signs and the project website.

How will the work affect you?

There will be temporary traffic changes on the Kings Highway to ensure the work zone is safe. A single lane closure, stop/slow traffic conditions and a 40km/h speed limit will be in place on the highway between Wharf and Reid streets.

For the safety of workers and road users, these traffic changes will be in place day and night for the duration of the work.

A map of the work area is provided over the page.
