

NEWCASTLE INNER CITY BYPASS: RANKIN PARK TO JESMOND (SSI-6888) ENVIRONMENTAL REPRESENTATIVE MONTHLY REPORT July 2022

Reporting Period: 1 to 31 July 2022

This Environmental Representative (ER) Monthly Report is prepared in accordance with the Minister's Condition of Approval A26(k) for the Newcastle Inner City Bypass: Rankin Park to Jesmond (SSI-6888) and is consistent with the Environmental Representative Protocol (October 2018).

PROJECT SUMMARY

Delivery of a 3.4km section of the Newcastle Inner City Bypass (NICB) which will be built between Rankin Park to Jesmond (RP2J) and to the west of the John Hunter Hospital.

The Rankin Park to Jesmond project is the fifth and final section of the NICB, which forms part of the Transport for NSW long term strategy to connect the Pacific Highway between Bennetts Green and Sandgate.

The project has been broken into four stages:

Stage 1: Detailed design investigations (geotechnical investigations) and low impact works (house demolition, heritage investigations, at-house noise treatment works) – in progress.

Stage 2: Shared Path Bridge – completed March 2021.

Stage 3: Southern Interchange Utilities relocation works – August 2022 completion.

Stage 4: Main RP2J road construction - Preconstruction.

Works Summary:

- Stage 1: House Demolition was completed June 2021, consultation of At House Noise Treatment (AHNT) works commenced March 2022
- Stage 2: Shared Path Bridge was completed March 2021
- Stage 3: Southern Interchange Utility Relocation works will be completed in August 2022
- Stage 4: Main Works are scheduled to commence in the first half of 2023.



July 2022 Completed Works:

Stage 1 - At House Noise Treatments

- Ongoing preparation of the property database (75 of 151 property inspections completed)
- Preparation of Scope of Works Reports for Stage 1 properties (50 of 151 properties)
- Commencement of subcontractor tenders for Stage 1 properties (50 of 151 properties)

Stage 1 - Culvert Works

Pending further investigation. These have been consolidated in Stage 4 main work.

Stage 3 - Southern Interchange Utilities relocation works

- Line 2 water main cutover partially completed
- Telecommunication cutovers completed
- Realigned concrete barriers and line marking on Lookout Road into final configuration
- Removed site offices from compound
- Restoration of concrete footpaths, kerbing and grassed areas

Stage 4 - Main Works

Post approval document preparation and detailed design

August 2022 Upcoming Works:

Stage 1 - At House Noise Treatments

- Ongoing preparation of the property database and inspections for Stage 2 properties
- Subcontractor tender assessment for Stage 1 properties (50 of 151 properties)

Stage 3 – Southern Interchange Utilities relocation works

- Removal of stockpiled material to another TfNSW project site for reuse
- Restoration of concrete footpaths, kerbing and grassed areas
- Grouting of redundant sewer mains
- Demobilise site compound
- Complete Line 2 water main cutover (subject to approval from Hunter Water)



Stage 4 – Main Works

 Low Impact (no impact) investigations, post approval document preparation and detailed design.
