

Noise testing for Newcastle Inner City Bypass from Wednesday 25 November

Transport for NSW is continuing to plan for the fifth section of the Newcastle Inner City Bypass between Rankin Park and Jesmond.

As part of planning for the next stage of the Newcastle Inner City Bypass we need to carry out sound transmission testing. The testing helps to determine the level of sound reduction through the façade of buildings from outside to inside. Testing will be carried out at a number of local community facilities near the project area, including at a facility near you.

What are we doing?

The sound transmission testing involves playing a loud noise from a speaker outside the building while sound measurements are taken.

Each sound transmission test may take up to two minutes to complete. The testing will be carried out on Wednesday 25 and Thursday 26 November.

How will the work affect you?

Your property falls within 100 metres of the location of a sound test and you may hear a loud noise played during the test. The noise will sound like loud radio static.

We will make every effort to minimise any impact to you and the community facilities where testing is carried out.
