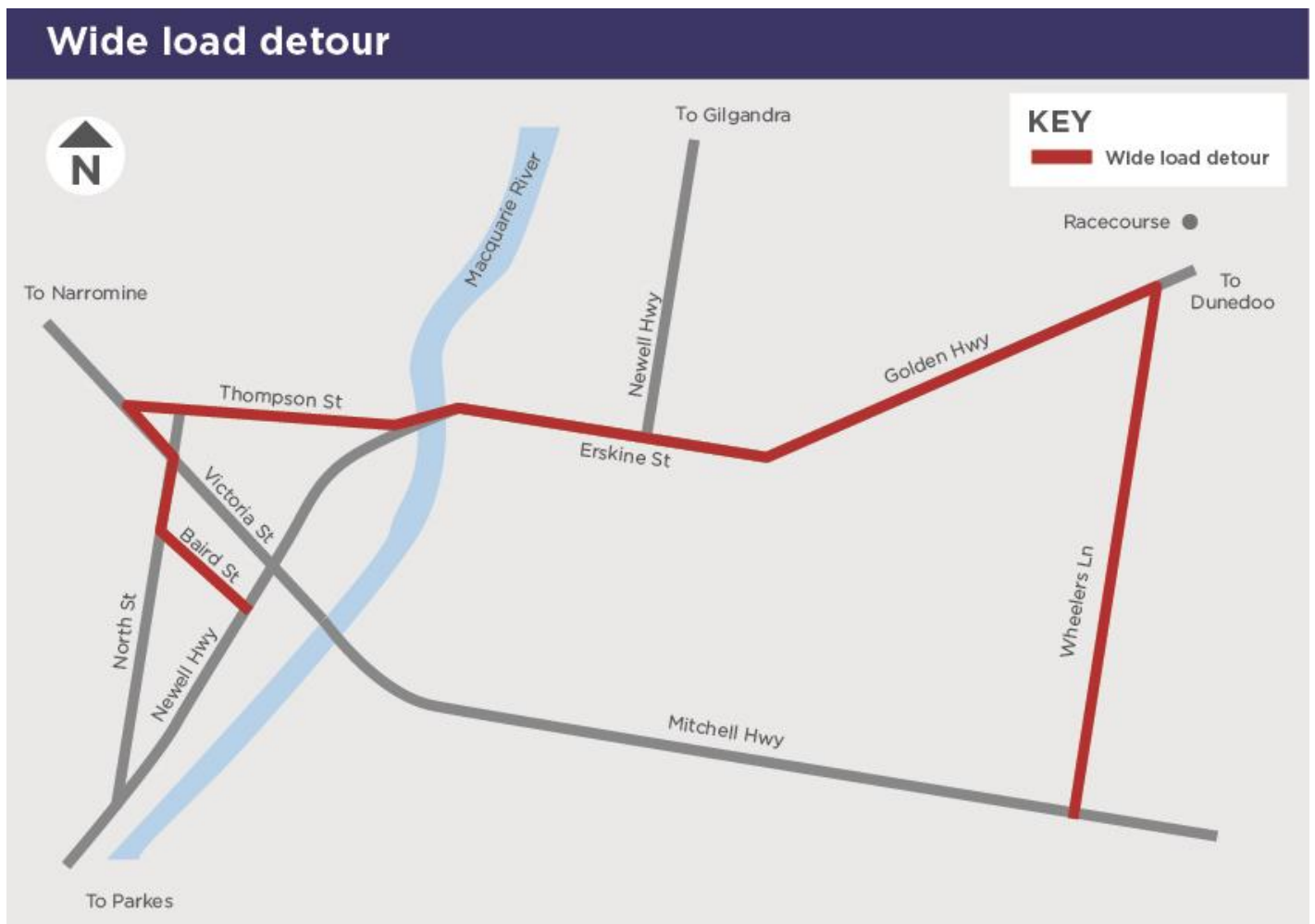


Detour arrangements on the Newell Highway and Mitchell Highway intersection from Thursday 15 April 2021

The NSW Government is funding \$20 million to upgrade the Newell Highway and Mitchell Highway intersection to improve safety and efficiency.



Work on the Newell Highway and Mitchell Highway intersection is progressing well, with the next step in construction to include building new pavement. To ensure the safety of workers and minimise community impact we will reduce lane width to 3.2m. A detour will be in place for wide load vehicles (refer to wide load detour map above).

Detour arrangements for heavy vehicles

From **Thursday 15 April 2021**, the Newell Highway and the Mitchell Highway intersection will be closed to wide load vehicles.

A wide load detour will be in place via Baird Street, North Street, Thompson Street, Erskine Street, Golden Highway and Wheelers Lane.

The work will be carried out during the day and some nights. However, the wide load detour will be in place 24 hours a day during construction.

Traffic changes

Changed traffic conditions including temporary traffic control, reduced lane widths, lane closures and a reduced speed limit of 40 km/h will be in place for the safety of workers and motorists.

Motorists are advised to allow an additional five minutes travel time, drive to the conditions and follow the directions of signs and traffic control.

Electronic message signs will be in place to give advance notice of the changed traffic conditions.
