



Storm water drainage and service relocation work on Forest Way between Warringah Road and Adams Street

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital to increase capacity on the road network and improve access through the area

Roads and Maritime Services has been carrying out service relocation work and also installing new storm water drainage.

This work on Forest Way between Warringah Road and Adams Street, will take place from Monday 29 January to Friday 30 June, weather permitting.

The work involves:

- · utility trenching, underboring and excavating
- removing redundant poles, pipes pits and conduits
- saw cutting footpaths and driveways
- temporarily restricting access to residents' and businesses' driveways
- installing poles, pipes, pits and stringing new cable
- installing new conduits, fittings, valves and pipes
- reinstating the road surface, footpaths and driveways.

To prepare the site, we will:

- implementing safety and environmental controls
- installing traffic controls, including temporary road or lane closures and detours
- installing barriers to delineate the work area
- establishing safe access and exit locations for workers and vehicles
- temporarily modifying pedestrian access
- · relocating bus stops and bus zones.

Some of this work will be carried out during our standard construction hours between **7am and 6pm** from **Monday to Friday**, and between **8am and 1pm on Saturday**. Due to the high volume of traffic and pedestrians in the area, some work will be carried out outside standard construction hours for safety reasons and to limit delays on the road network. This out of hours work will be carried out between **8pm** and **5am** from **Monday** to **Friday**.

Further notifications about specific work activities will be distributed as required.

We have provided a map overleaf to show the location of the work.

How will the work affect you?

The work will require crossing driveways, which will temporarily impact access to properties along Forest Way. Direct contact with each impacted stakeholder will take place.

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will use noise shields to dampen noise where appropriate and ensure equipment and vehicles are turned off when not in use. We will focus lights only on the working area, however there is likely to be some spill-over of light into some nearby residences.

Traffic changes

The temporary traffic changes are needed to ensure the safety of workers, motorists, cyclists and pedestrians and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times, although minor temporary detours may be in place.
