



Service relocation on Warringah Road, near Fitzpatrick Avenue from Thursday 1 September

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital with work proposed to be completed in time for the hospital opening in 2018.

As previously notified, Roads and Maritime Services has been relocating services at Warringah Road, near Fitzpatrick Avenue. Further work will be carried out from **Thursday 1 September**.

This work will involve:

- Installing traffic controls
- Saw cutting on Warringah Road and footpaths
- Removing a section of concrete median on Warringah Road
- Potholing and service identification
- Installing site fencing to delineate the work area
- Temporarily modifying pedestrian access
- Trenching and underboring across Warringah Road from Fitzpatrick Avenue East to Fitzpatrick Avenue West
- Carrying out earthwork and pavement work
- Establishing safe access and egress points for workers and vehicles
- Clearing of vegetation and trees
- Installing cables and relocating services
- Delivering equipment and materials.

Work will be carried out from **Thursday 1 September** until the **end of October**, weather permitting. Some of this work will be carried out during our standard construction hours of **7am** to **6pm** on **weekdays** and **8am** to **1pm** on **Saturdays**.

Due to the high volume of traffic and pedestrians in this area, some of the work will be carried out at night for safety reasons and to limit the impact on the road network. There will be **up to 23 shifts** of night work from **Thursday 1 September** until **Monday 31 October** between **6pm** and **7am**, weather permitting.

Further notifications will be distributed as the work progresses.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise, dust and disruption associated with this work. Machinery and equipment used may include lighting towers, excavators, trucks, chainsaws, cranes, mulching machines, light vehicles, rollers, vacuum trucks, under boring rig, elevated work platforms, road saw, compactors, jack hammer and hand tools.

We will make every effort to minimise the impacts by arranging work in stages at different locations, working at night only when necessary and using flexible noise shields to reduce noise, where possible. We will carry out the work in shifts so you will not be affected for more than three consecutive nights per week. Lighting towers will be directed away from residential properties, wherever possible. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times, although minor temporary detours may be in place during the work.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe for workers, pedestrians and motorists. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
