Service preparation and installation on Warringah Road and Forest Way from Thursday 23 June

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital with work proposed to be completed in time for the hospital opening in 2018.

Roads and Maritime Services will prepare and install services along Warringah Road and Forest Way from **Thursday 23 June**.

The work will involve:

Site preparation:

- Installing traffic controls and temporarily modifying pedestrian access
- Establishing safe access and egress points for workers and vehicles
- Non-destructive excavation of existing services prior to commencement of work

Installing services:

- Potholing and identifying services
- Installation of a new water main along Warringah Road

We have provided a map to show the location of the work.

Work will be carried out from **Thursday 23 June** until **Monday 15 August 2016**, weather permitting. Some of this work will be carried out during our standard construction hours of **7am** to **6pm** on **weekdays** and **8am** to **1pm** on **Saturdays**.

Due to the high volume of traffic and pedestrians in this area, some of the work will be carried out at night for safety reasons and to limit the impact on the road network. There will be up to **20 shifts of night work** from **Thursday 23 June** until **Monday 15 August 2016**, between **6pm** and **7am**, weather permitting.


Further notifications will be distributed as the work progresses.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise, dust, vibration and disruption associated with this work. Machinery and equipment used may include lighting towers, excavators, trucks, hydraulic chainsaws, cranes, concrete cutters, light vehicles, under boring rig, elevated work platforms, pole borer, road saw, compactors, Boogies, tippers, grinders, jackhammer and hand tools.



We will make every effort to minimise noise by arranging the work in stages at different locations, working at night only when necessary and using flexible noise shields where possible to reduce noise generated by construction activities. We will carry out the work in shifts so you will not be affected for more than three consecutive nights per week. Lighting towers will be directed away from residential properties wherever possible. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times, although minor temporary detours may be in place during the work



Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
