



Night work on Ballina Street Bridge on the Bruxner Highway, Lismore, from Monday 29 May

Roads and Maritime Services will carry out essential repair work on Ballina Street Bridge. The bridge's cross beams were damaged last year when a truck carrying an excavator struck the cross beams.

Roads and Maritime completed a \$5 million project to repaint the bridge in June last year. Soon after the project was complete the bridge was damaged.

Work to repair the damage will involve removing and replacing the damaged cross beams and painting.

Due to high traffic volumes on the bridge and to minimise impacts on the community, we will carry out the work at night and on weekends.

The bridge will be closed during night work to minimise the impacts on the community and for the safety of the public and our workers.

Night work

We will be working between **7pm** and **5am** on the following nights, weather permitting:

- Monday 29 May
- Tuesday 30 May
- Monday 5 June
- Tuesday 6 June
- Wednesday 7 June (if required).

Weekend work

We will be working on the following weekends, weather permitting:

- Saturday 3 June (between 8am and 5pm)
- Sunday 4 June (between 8am and 5pm)
- Saturday 17 June (between 8am and 5pm)
- Sunday 18 June (between 8am and 5pm).



How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise any noise impacts.

Access to properties near the bridge will be maintained at all times during the work.

Traffic changes

During the night work the bridge will be closed between 7pm and 5am.

Motorists will be able to cross the Wilson River via Fawcett and Colemans bridges. A signposted detour will be in place.

For the weekend work, traffic will be reduced to one lane, alternate flow across the bridge during work hours. The road will be opened back to two lanes outside work hours.

Speed restrictions will be in place for the safety of workers, motorists and other road users.

Motorists may experience delays of up to 15 minutes and are advised to plan their journey, allow extra travel time and follow all signs.
