# Sportsmans Creek new bridge project

**COMMUNITY UPDATE – REVIEW OF ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS** 

The NSW Government is funding the Sportsmans Creek new bridge as part of the Bridges for the Bush initiative. An environmental assessment has been completed for the project and is now available on the project website.

# **Current status**

Roads and Maritime Services is continuing to plan for the Sportsmans Creek new bridge. A recommended option was displayed in November – December 2013 and was confirmed as the preferred option in July 2014.

A review of environmental factors (REF) has been completed for building the new bridge. The REF assessed the proposed bridge against relevant NSW legislation and other environmental planning requirements. It also identifies all environmental impacts associated with the Sportsmans Creek new bridge and includes mitigation measures to minimise these impacts.

The REF is now available to view on the project website.

The existing Sportsmans Creek bridge would be removed after the new bridge is built. The impacts of removing the existing bridge are being assessed separately. The project team is looking at ways to recognise the history of the existing bridge following removal.

# Next steps

Now that the REF process for constructing the new bridge is complete, a number of enabling works will start in preparation for building the bridge. These may include:

- Power relocation
- Removal of the building at the southern end of Grafton Street
- Investigations to inform the detailed design.

Announce project start (May 2013)

Announce study area and meet with community to identify local priorities and issues (July 2013)

Consider community feedback and technical studies to develop options (August 2013)

Display recommended option for community feedback (Recommended Option Report – November 2013)

Consider community feedback and undertake further studies and field work (January 2014)

Prepare the Preferred Option Report

Consideration and decision by Roads and Maritime and the Minister for Roads and Freight on the preferred option

Announce the preferred option

## Flo Clark Park public boat ramp closure

During the building phase of the Sportsmans Creek new bridge, the public boat ramp in Flo Clark Park will not be available for public use due to its proximity to the work site.

Alternative access to the Clarence River will be available from the boat ramp in Memorial Park, Lawrence.

Roads and Maritime will be seeking to minimise the length of time access to Flo Clark Park boat ramp is restricted.

The community will be kept informed of any changed access arrangements.
