Olympic Highway intersection upgrades

Old Narrandera Road concept design

Proposal details

Transport for NSW is installing traffic lights at the Olympic Highway and Old Narrandera Road intersection to provide the best immediate improvements to road safety at this location. In finalising this solution, we considered the future growth of the northern suburbs, safety and efficiency, as well as impacts on the surrounding environment and road network.





A dedicated right-hand turning lane plus a right/left-hand turning lane on Old Narrandera Road will allow motorists to safely enter the Olympic Highway from two lanes instead of one. Traffic lights will be phased to prioritise traffic on the Olympic Highway, to improve traffic flow and efficiency.

Left-hand lane retained

The left-hand exit lane onto Old Narrandera Road will be retained. Traffic entering Old Narrandera Road from the northbound lane will not use the traffic lights. Motorists will not need to merge, but will enter their own lane which will continue to Pine Gully Road roundabout, yet to be built by Wagga Wagga City Council.

3 Additional turning lane

An additional turning lane for motorists turning left from Old Narrandera Road onto the Olympic Highway is proposed in the concept plan. Traffic turning left will not have to merge when turning onto the Olympic Highway.

4 Right-hand turning lane retained

The right-hand turning heading southbound will be retained. Traffic lights will control traffic entering Old Narrandera Road.

5 Two northbound lanes, linking to Boorooma Street ramp The concept design proposes an extra northbound lane from south of Old Narrandera Road to the existing Boorooma Street ramp into

6 Two southbound lanes, linking from Boorooma Street ramp

The southbound ramp connecting Boorooma Street to the Olympic Highway will continue as a new stand-alone lane past Old Narrandera Road. Traffic merging onto the highway from Estella via Boorooma Street won't have to merge before the new traffic lights.

7 Southbound merge to single lane

Traffic will merge into a single lane south of the intersection on the Olympic Highway to travel over the Gobbagombalin Bridge.
