

Pacific Highway Charmhaven

Community Consultation Report April 2021

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1 Introduction

1.1. Background

Transport for NSW investigated safety improvements along a 1.7 kilometre section of the Pacific Highway at Charmhaven, between Moala Parade and Lowana Avenue, as part of the Safer Roads program.

Our proposed improvements for the Pacific Highway safety upgrades project would reduce the risk and severity of crashes.

Consultation for the proposed safety improvements was carried out in February 2020.

1.2. The proposal

The February 2020 proposal included:

- providing dedicated right turn bays on the Pacific Highway to assist motorists turning into Jetty Avenue, the shopping village service road and Awaba Avenue
- installing raised concrete medians to prevent motorists from making right turn movements in and out of Parkside Drive, Norah Avenue, Windermere Avenue and Munmorah Avenue. These intersections would become left in and left out only
- banning the right turn from the Pacific Highway into Lowana Avenue (the right turn movement from Lowana Avenue onto the Pacific Highway would still be permitted)
- widening the western side of the Pacific Highway to accommodate the new right turn bays and medians
- installing 170 metres of guardrail to help prevent motorists from veering off the road
- some minor improvements to the shopping village service road
- installing new signage and improving line marking.

2 Consultation approach

2.1 Consultation objectives

We consulted with the community and key stakeholders on the proposal to:

- inform the community and stakeholders of the proposal and possible impacts
- seek feedback on the proposal and issues of concern for consideration in developing the detailed design and method of construction. The feedback will be incorporated into the environmental impact assessment.
- build a database of interested and concerned community members with whom we can continue to engage with during the proposal's development.

2.2 Values

Our values underpin our decisions and behaviours when working with customers, colleagues, stakeholders and partners.

2.3 How consultation was done

We consulted with the community in February 2020 on the proposed design. Community members were encouraged to provide their feedback via mail, email, online or by phone contact with the Project Manager. Our key consultation tools are listed below:

The Project Manager also consulted directly with Central Coast Council to seek their feedback on the proposed design.

3 Consultation summary

3.1 Overview

Comments on the proposed upgrade closed on Friday 14 February 2020, with 41 submissions received about a range of issues. Some submissions included multiple comments and raised multiple issues.

The feedback received in formal submissions raised a number of issues including requests for right turn facility at intersections, upgrades to the highway corridor, requests for traffic lights or a roundabout at the intersection and concern about the condition of side streets.

After considering all responses, along with the proposal's aims and design requirements, we have completed additional investigations and design work to help inform the next steps for the proposal.

3.2 Recommendations

A majority of feedback related to improvements to intersections and upgrades to the road corridor. We are unable to address all of these issues with the current funding and project scope, however Transport for NSW has sought additional funding to provide a u-turn facility on the Pacific Highway. The u-turn facility will allow motorists to safely change their direction of travel and help to minimise travel time impacts associated with the removal of right turn movements onto the highway.

In addition to the u-turn facility, Transport for NSW has also carried out further investigations and has made some changes to the design of the project following a review of the feedback. We will be proceeding with the project with some changes, including:

- changing the proposed concrete median at Parkside Avenue to a painted median to retain access for rural fire service vehicles during emergencies
- Installing a 0.6m wide painted median between Awaba Avenue and Lowana Ave in place of the concrete median originally proposed

We will work closely with local residents and stakeholders in relation to the potential impacts of this project. We will do this by:

- informing the community and stakeholders of consultation outcomes and the next steps for the proposal via publication of this report
- continuing to carry out communication activities as the project progresses and informing the community through the Transport for NSW website and project notifications.

3.3 Next steps

We have considered all submissions and will ensure our team is aware of concerns raised by the community. We will ensure issues highlighted by stakeholders and the community that are unable to be addressed by this project will be considered for future funding.

We will continue to keep the community informed of the project progress. Work on the project is expected to start in late April 2021.

Have your say – Proposed safety improvements on the Pacific Highway, Charmhaven

The NSW Government is investing in a proposal to improve safety between Awaba Avenue and Moala Parade.

Transport for NSW is seeking your feedback on a proposal to improve safety along this 1.7 kilometre section of the Pacific Highway at Charmhaven.

In the five years to June 2019, there were 41 crashes along this section of the highway, including 26 rear end crashes and 30 crashes which resulted in injury.

We have included a map to show the proposed work, which aims to reduce the risk and severity of crashes along the highway.

The proposal involves:

- providing dedicated right turn bays on the Pacific Highway to assist motorists turning into Jetty Avenue, the shopping village service road and Awaba Avenue
- installing raised concrete medians to prevent motorists from making right turn movements in and out of Parkside Drive, Norah Avenue, Windermere Avenue and Munmorah Avenue. These intersections will become left in and left out only
- banning the right turn from the Pacific Highway into Lowana Avenue (the right turn movement from Lowana Avenue onto the Pacific Highway will still be permitted)
- widening the western side of the Pacific Highway to accommodate the new right turn bays and medians
- installing 170 metres of guardrail to help prevent motorists from veering off the road
- some minor improvements to the shopping village service road
- installing new signage and improving line marking.



Project update – Safety improvements on the Pacific Highway, Charmhaven

The Australian and NSW Governments are investing in a project to improve safety and reduce the risk of crashes between Moala Parade and Lowana Avenue.

Transport for NSW sought feedback from the community in February 2020 on a proposal to improve safety along this 1.7 kilometre section of the Pacific Highway at Charmhaven.

Following a review of feedback, further investigations and design work have been carried out. A project design has now been finalised and incorporates some changes responding to the feedback we received.

The project now includes a U-turn bay which will be built south of Jetty Road. The U-turn bay will allow motorists to safely change their direction of travel to head north on the Pacific Highway. It will also help to minimise travel time impacts associated with the removal of right turn movements onto the highway.

The previously proposed concrete median at Parkside Avenue will be replaced with a wide painted central median which means access for emergency vehicles will be retained. Right turn in and out of Parkside Avenue will still be prohibited for all other vehicles.

The final project involves:

- Building a U-turn bay south of Jetty Road, for motorists wanting to travel north on the Pacific Highway
- Providing dedicated right turn bays for motorists turning into Jetty Avenue and Awaba Avenue
- Installing a wide painted central median to provide greater distance between opposing traffic north of Awaba Avenue
- Banning right turn movements in and out of Parkside Drive, Norah Avenue, Windermere Avenue and Munmorah Avenue. These intersections will become left in and left out only. Access for emergency vehicles will be permitted
- Banning the right turn from the Pacific Highway into Lowana Avenue (the right turn movement from Lowana Avenue onto the Pacific Highway will still be permitted)
- Widening the western side of the Pacific Highway to accommodate the new right turn bays and medians
- Installing new signage and improving line marking.

Work on the project is expected to start in late April. We will notify the community before work starts.
