

Pennant Hills Road, North Parramatta

Project update – Pedestrian Bridge

Roads and Maritime Services | January 2018

The NSW Government is funding this \$5 million project to provide a safe crossing over Pennant Hills Road for pedestrians and cyclists.

Roads and Maritime Services is building a pedestrian bridge over Pennant Hills Road, North Parramatta.

To complete this work, a full road closure will be in place while the bridge span is lifted into place. We have included a map of the detour route.

Progress so far and next stage

We have finished clearing vegetation, moving and protecting the heritage pillars, building the foundation of the bridge and a retaining wall.

Work to be completed includes:

- building and painting the lift shafts and stairs
- installing the lifts and related electrical work
- lifting the bridge into place
- landscaping.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

In order to lift the bridge into place Pennant Hills Road will be closed between James Ruse Drive and Bettington Road. We have provided a map to help explain the detour routes for light and medium vehicles during the closure.

The road will be closed at **9pm** on **Saturday 20 January** and will reopen at **9am** on **Sunday 21** January. Resident and emergency services access will be maintained at all times via the intersection of Pennant Hills Road and Bettington Road. No access can be granted via the intersection of James Ruse Drive and Pennant Hills Road.

If the bridge lift is postponed due to poor weather the work will be carried out on **Saturday 3 February** or **Saturday 24 February**. This will involve the same working hours and road closures/detours.

The detour may add up to 30 minutes extra travel time. Motorists are advised to plan ahead where possible to avoid delays.

Our work schedule

Once the bridge span is in place, we will continue to be on site for another **15 night shifts** and **160 day shifts** until **Monday**, **30 April** weather permitting, excluding public holidays.

Our night work hours will be between **7pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Friday**.

Our day work hours will be between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday** and between **8am** and **1pm** on **Saturdays**. We will not be working on public holidays.

To minimise traffic disruptions, we will lift the bridge span into place in **one shift** on the night of **Saturday 20 January**, from **9pm** to **9am**, weather permitting.

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times. We will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing noisier tasks by **11pm**.
