Project update – start of work (Stage 1)

Roads and Maritime Services | February 2018

The NSW Government is funding this work as part of its \$30 million Parramatta Congestion Improvement Program which aims to reduce congestion around the Parramatta local government area by upgrading key intersections that access the Parramatta Central Business District.

Roads and Maritime Services is improving the intersections of Pitt Street and Marsden Street along the Great Western Highway, Parramatta. These improvements will be completed in two stages.

We have included a map showing the location of work.

Our work schedule

We will be working on Stage 1 for up to **five nights a week** for up to **80 night shifts** over a **16 week period**, between **Thursday 15 March, 2018** and **Friday 24 August, 2018** weather permitting.

Our work hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Friday**. We will not be working public holidays.

Stage one

Stage one of the works will include:

- providing an eastbound left turn lane on the Great Western Highway into Marsden Street
- extending the westbound right turn lane on the Great Western Highway into Pitt Street
- modifying the layout of traffic lights on the Great Western Highway at the intersections of O'Connell Street and Marsden Street.

Stage two

Stage two of the work is expected to start in the second half of 2018. Stage two will include:

- providing a westbound left turn lane on the Great Western Highway into Pitt Street
- providing three northbound lanes in Pitt Street on approach to the Great Western Highway
- providing a southbound lane in Pitt Street on the departure from the Great Western Highway

We will write to you with more information closer to the start of work.

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times however we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing the noisier tasks by **11pm** and working in different locations.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.
