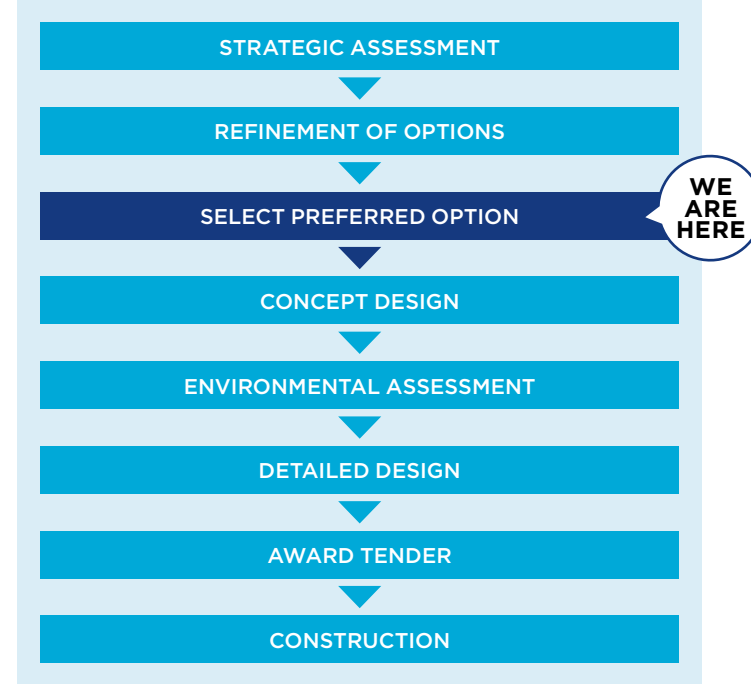

Princes Highway upgrade

Preferred option for the Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection upgrade | November 2020

The intersection provides access to and from the Bay and Basin community

A grade separated interchange, or flyover, has been identified as the preferred option for the Jervis Bay Road and Princes Highway intersection upgrade.

Why was this option chosen?

In consultations earlier this year, the community told us safety for transport users and less congestion are key priorities for an intersection upgrade.

Transport investigated a range of options and determined the preferred option would be the safest option and provide the best results for congestion, resilience and connectivity compared to other options assessed.

We welcome feedback on the preferred option until **Sunday 20 December**.

The Australian and NSW Governments have announced \$1.5 billion towards upgrading the Princes Highway between Jervis Bay Road and the Victorian border.

An upgraded intersection at Jervis Bay Road is a priority project and part of a 20 year plan to deliver a safe, reliable, efficient and connected transport network between Jervis Bay and the Victorian border.
