# **Prospect Highway upgrade**

Project update | December 2021

The Australian and NSW Governments are investing \$280 million towards upgrading 3.6 kilometres of Prospect Highway between Reservoir Road, Prospect and St Martins Crescent, Blacktown.

# **Major contract award**

Transport for NSW has appointed Fulton Hogan to deliver the Prospect Highway upgrade with work scheduled to start in late 2021.

Prospect Highway is a major roadway through Western Sydney which connects motorists with the M4 Motorway, the Great Western Highway, Old Windsor Road and the M2 Motorway. Around 35,000 vehicles currently use Prospect Highway each day, including 5000 heavy vehicles.

Prospect Highway, between Reservoir Road, Prospect and St Martins Crescent, Blacktown is currently an undivided two lane road (one lane in each direction) which causes congestion and delays for motorists.

We look forward to delivering this important upgrade to improve travel time, safety and reduce congestion for all road users. We will provide more information on the detailed construction schedule in the coming months.

## **Project background**

Transport for NSW is upgrading Prospect Highway to provide a 3.6 kilometre four lane divided road which will cater for forecast transport growth along this corridor.

The upgrade will play a key role in supporting the 30-minute city concept outlined in the Future Transport Strategy 2056.

Prospect Highway provides a major connection point through Western Sydney connecting motorists with:

- M4 Motorway
- · Great Western Highway
- · Old Windsor Road
- M2 Motorway

Additionally, Prospect Highway links the Wetherill Park industrial area and the Greystanes employment area with the M4 Motorway, the Great Western Highway and Blacktown City centre. The corridor serves as a key route for many businesses across Western Sydney.

Around 35,000 vehicles currently use Prospect Highway each day, including 5000 heavy vehicles.

## **Project benefits**

Benefits of the upgrade include:

- improving safety and access for local and through traffic
- · improving safety for cyclists and pedestrians
- improving travel times and reducing congestion on Prospect Highway between Blacktown and the M4 Motorway
- supporting public transport with kerbside bus lanes
- · supporting freight movement

## **Features**

Key features of the upgrade include:

- widening 3.6 kilometres of Prospect Highway to four lanes with a central median (two lanes in each direction)
- duplicating the bridges over the M4 Motorway and the Great Western Highway
- pedestrian underpass bridge on Prospect Highway between Blacktown Road and Harrod Street
- a new two way link road between the Great Western Highway and Prospect Highway, with traffic lights at each end of the new road
- new traffic lights at Stoddart Road, Reservoir Road and the M4 Motorway eastbound entry and exit ramps
- changing vehicle access at Vesuvius Street, Tudor Avenue and Ponds Road to become left in left out only and Roger Place to become left and right in but left out only

- resurfacing and line marking of the existing shared path on the western side of Prospect Highway between Reservoir Road and St Martins Crescent
- installing a kerbside bus lane in each direction between Lancelot Street and north of St Martins Crescent
- new kiss-and-ride facility at Shelly Public School
- improving the intersection at Hadrian Avenue and Keyworth Drive by installing a roundabout to improve traffic flow
- changing the posted speed limit on Prospect Highway between Reservoir Road and St Martins Crescent, from 60km/h to 70km/h

The project is expected to be completed in late 2024.

## **Early works**

Work is continuing on a new roundabout at Hadrian Avenue and Keyworth Drive at Prospect as well as a kiss-and-ride facility at Shelley Public School, with completion expected on both installations in the coming months.

The majority of early works involving key utility relocation required for the future upgrade including relocating the existing electrical network along the road corridor has now been completed. The remaining utility relocation work will continue to be delivered alongside major construction with Fulton Hogan.

# **Upcoming work**

Fulton Hogan will carry out early works that will include:

- construction of the site compound facilities
- · survey work on property and road surface
- preparation works for the new bridges by creating access for construction and work equipment
- site inspections
- · locating services and utilities
- · earthworks and drainage works
- installation of temporary safety barriers and traffic management
- · some tree clearing and shrub removal

### **Noise**

We will do everything we can to lessen the disturbance including:

- · turning off machinery when not in use
- positioning equipment such as generators as far away as possible from residential areas
- · using non-intrusive reversing alarms on all machinery

## **Construction hours**

Most of the time work will be carried out during standard working hours between **7am** and **6pm Monday** to **Friday** and **Saturday** between **8am** and **1pm**, weather permitting.

Night and weekend work will be required from time to time to lessen the disturbance to traffic. We will notify you in advance when we need to carry out work during these times.

## **Traffic**

During construction, the existing speed limits will be maintained during peak hours but may be reduced at night for the safety of workers and motorists.

During the construction of the new bridges over the M4 Motorway and the Great Western Highway the speed on these roads will be reduced.


